


MORNING WORK:

There is not formal homework sent home nightly. We want to encourage you to be an active participant in your child's learning this year! Discuss what they are learning in class.




IDEAS FOR FAMILY ENGAGEMENT






MAP TESTING: 3 times a year (Fall, Winter, Spring)

UNIT ASSESSMENTS IN READING AND MATH: Based on Kentucky Academic Standards and FCPS Pacing Guides


"CHECK-INS" IN READING AND MATH: Formative Assessments

UFLI - Phonics Program that is a continuation from first grade. Students are very familiar with the concepts and are doing great!




ATTENDANCE

MEDICATION REMINDERS




All medications, including over the counter medications (cough drops and sunscreen), **MUST** be kept in the office with the proper forms completed




Procedures:

Birthday Treats: peanut and tree nut free!




PLANNERS AND TAKE HOME FOLDERS

TRANSPORTATION





PLEASE make sure the tag is **ALWAYS** on your child's backpack – double check if/when you get them a new one!

COMMUNICATION




ParentSquare is the first line of communication! Let me know if you need help signing up!

Grade-level newsletters send home weekly on Sundays via ParentSquare from Mrs. Kippler




COMMUNICATION



Quarterly Report Cards are sent home.


One formal Parent-Teacher conference in the fall (be on the lookout for those dates!)

Conferences are available upon request by parent or teacher! (information can only be shared with a legal guardian unless written permission is given to a school administration!)




EOS


Field Trip Dates:
