About Minneapolis Public Schools:

Minneapolis Public Schools is the third largest school district in the state, serving over 35,000 students in 75 schools, grades prek-12. Our students are ethnically, racially, linguistically, economically and religiously diverse, representing over forty countries and speaking 96 languages.

About Edison High School:

Thomas Edison High School is a certified International Baccalaureate World School and certified Middle Years Programme School. We are also considered the greenest campus in the state with our focus on urban agricultural studies, onsite greenhouse, solar energy use and more. We serve approximately 900 students in grades 9-12.

International Baccalaureate Curriculum:

Thomas Edison High School offers two levels of International Baccalaureate classes: the Middle Years Program (MYP) and the Diploma Program (DP). The IB Middle Years Program (MYP) serves all 9th and 10th grade students at Edison. The MYP provides a framework of academic challenge that encourages students to embrace the connections between traditional academics and the real world, to value international mindedness, and become critical and reflective thinkers. The IB Diploma Program (DP) is an optional academic program for 11th and 12th graders. Students may take up to six different IB subjects with summative exams that can yield college credit. "Full IB Diploma Candidates" take six two-year IB DP courses as well as the three core elements of the Program: Theory of Knowledge, an independent extended essay, and a portfolio of Creativity-Activity-Service experiences.

Grades & Schedules:

We do not weight grades at Edison High School for any of our courses, however, students are ranked. Students each have a 7 period week (Blocks - A & B days) and an Advisory course (homeroom). We offer semester and year long courses, students receive a letter grade at the end of each quarter. All classes on the transcript are divided into quarters. Students have the opportunity to earn .25 credits per class, per quarter—or 1.0 credit for a full year of a single class. Advisory is worth .175 per quarter. GPA is cumulative and computed quarterly for all courses in which a grade is received.

COVID: For quarter 4 of the 2019-2020 school year, Edison High School began distance learning and only grades of CR (credit) or NC (no credit) were only given to students for that quarter; no letter grades

All of Edison High School was in distance learning for over a year, including quarter 4 of the 2019-2020 school year and quarters 1-3 of the 2020-2021 school year/

For quarter 4 of the 2020-2021 school year, students had the option of coming in person or continuing distance learning
