District Leadership Opportunities

- Budget Advisory Committee (BAC): Review and provide input on the district's budget.
- District Advisory Committee (DAC): Advises on behalf of Title I program participants.
- District English Learner Advisory Committee (DELAC): Advises the district on programs for English Learners.
- Wellness Committee: Contribute to the health and well-being of students.
- Parent Committee for Special Education: Collaborate and share ideas to support students with special needs.
- Preschool Parent Advisory Committee: Help plan and evaluate the State Preschool program.
- Independent Citizens Oversight Committee: Oversee the implementation of district general obligation bonds.

School Site Opportunities

- Family Volunteers: Assist in classrooms, the library, or the school office.
- School Site Council (SSC): Develop and monitor the Single Plan for Student Achievement (SPSA) to improve the school's academic program.
- School Safety and Security Committee: Help create and maintain a safe school environment.
- Parent Teacher Organizations (PTA/PTO) and Booster Clubs: Support student education and specific programs through various activities.

Annual Events & Workshops for Families

- Collaborative Partners Meeting (Monthly): Resource sharing and networking through the Chula Vista Community Collaborative (CVCC). Second Tuesday of each month (except July).
- Community Expo (Annual): Explore district programs, access resources, and enjoy family activities at the start of the school year.
- CVESD University (Ongoing): Workshops designed to equip families with tools to support their child's education.
- Day of the Child (Annual): Free resources, information, and activities for families at Memorial Park in Chula Vista (through CVCC).
- Station Experiences Field Trip (Annual): Interactive learning day about innovative district programs (principal nomination required).
- Station Experiences Community Events (Ongoing): Open houses showcasing innovative CVESD programs.
