PREVENTION

Mercer Island High School has been affiliated with UW's Forefront Suicide Prevention Program since 2015 with the goal of reducing the risk of suicide. Through the use of the LEARN curriculum, we strive to educate parents, students, and staff about the signs of suicide and provide the tools necessary to prevent suicide within our community.

Nationally, suicide rates have been increasing for two decades now. And during this time Washington's suicide rate has remained higher than the national average. Moreover, youth suicide has risen in recent years, along with anxiety and depression.

AP exams are designed for students currently enrolled in College Board AP courses, but may also be appropriate for students who have learned the requisite knowledge in other ways (home-school, self-study, etc.)



A message from MI Youth and Family Services



Dear Parents & Caregivers

Through a unique partnership between the City of Mercer Island, the Mercer Island School District and MIYFS two licensed mental health counselors are available onsite at MIHS. Chris Harnish and Caleb Visser work collaboratively with students, families and school staff to support the social and emotional needs of MI teens as they navigate their way through the school year.

The R&R (which stands for Resources and Referrals) is based on-campus at MIHS and offers students a safe, confidential space to gather informally on a drop-in basis and to seek out support/guidance around the many issues facing adolescents today.

The MIYFS counselors are available to provide a range of services, including individual counseling, facilitating youth leadership and development programs, teaching emotional selfcare skills, substance abuse education, prevention and assessment services and if necessary assisting in making referrals to providers outside of the school setting. These services are also available to students who attend the Crest Learning Center.

How do I order an official transcript
