Dear Families and Community Members,

On behalf of Wilson County Schools, I encourage you to review our district's 2024-2025 North Carolina School Report Card. The report card includes data about the district as a whole and also highlights our individual schools.

Wilson County Schools continued to experience gains in proficiency and growth for the 2024-2025 school year. The district is now ranked 34th out of 115 districts in the state in overall proficiency compared to 37th in the state last school year. This is the highest state ranking Wilson County Schools has ever achieved, and we are just 2.5 percentage points away from being one of the Top 20 performing districts in the state.

Students scored at 56.4% proficient overall, an increase of 0.3% compared to the previous year. For reference, the top performing district in the state scored at 70.7%. Our growth scores also indicate the tremendous impact teachers are having on student success. Growth is a measure based on achieving one year's worth of learning for students. Twenty-one out of 24 schools met or exceeded growth this year, which included all of our elementary schools. Nineteen of our schools ranked in the top half across the state for growth.

While we are always excited about our great results, I want to emphasize that our students are more than just test scores. We love them and are committed to helping them realize their full potential. The mission of Wilson County Schools is to provide an educational environment which creates success for all students through the community working together. I want to celebrate the dedication and hard work of every teacher, staff member, administrator and district leader who went above and beyond for students. This kind of sustained success is not easy, and it reflects the shared commitment to student success of our entire Wilson County Schools Family. Our district has made great progress, and I know it will continue.
