OVERVIEW

St George's is an inclusive, not-for-profit British International School and one of the leading UK and IB curriculum schools in continental Europe. It offers a broad and rigorous academic programme alongside an enriching range of co-curricular activities. A pastoral system, embedded throughout the school, provides individual care and support for every learner. Founded in 1958 to serve Rome's expatriate community, the main campus is a 25 acre site in the north of the city. St George's is a member of HMC, an exclusive group of private schools in Britain and overseas.





CURRICULUM

St George's has been an IB World School since 1996 and offers the IB Diploma at post-16. From 2025, A-Levels have been introduced as a second pathway available to students, with the first set of results to be released in summer 2027. Both the IBDP and A-Levels are underpinned by a High School Diploma accredited by NEASC.

FACULTY

The teaching staff at St George's are mainly British nationals, with a small number of teachers of other nationalities. All are highly experienced and have previously taught in schools in the UK or internationally. They each hold university degrees, many have higher degrees and they all have postgraduate teaching qualifications.

LEARNING AND TEACHING

The school follows a strong British curriculum and tradition, with English as the language of instruction, yet it is truly international in every respect. Mathematics, the Sciences, English and foreign languages are at the heart of the curriculum, alongside an expansive range of core and optional subjects.

STUDENT BODY AND CLASSES

The students at St George's come from over 100 different countries. A large number of families have connections to the United Nations and to the Diplomatic communities of Rome and the Vatican. The annual graduating class is typically 88 students, and an average class size for Sixth Form students is 14.

CO-CURRICULAR PROGRAMME

Beyond the curriculum, students can participate in over 200 different clubs and activities. There are 20 active music ensembles, orchestras and choirs, and frequent theatre productions. St George's is an accredited Athlete Friendly Education Centre (AFEC). Sports teams include football, basketball, tennis, rugby and netball. Other clubs include MUN, Coding, Art, and Pride Club.

STUDENT LEADERSHIP AND HOUSE SYSTEM

All students have the opportunity to take on leadership positions within the school. Six Student Leadership Committees, for Teaching and Learning, Community, Sustainability, Well Being, Resources and CCAs, are formed annually by students in Years 7 to 13. The House System plays a key role in the school structure, with the four Houses electing their own Captains and House Representatives each year.
