	Students in Grade 3 have 120 minutes of Tier 1, core instruction per day.
	This time is spent on reading, writing, speaking, and listening, and language.
	The school uses Core Knowledge Language Arts published by Amplify Education in
	Grades K-2 - both the Skills and Knowledge strands - as its Tier 1 curriculum.
	The Skills curriculum provides students with instruction in phonemic
	awareness, decoding, and spelling. It grows in complexity from kindergarten
	through 2nd grade. The Knowledge strand uses read-alouds and writing
ELA Textbooks and	activities to build students' knowledge of science, social studies, and literature.
	It also provides students with the opportunity to learn and use diverse

	Literacy benchmark assessments are given at BOY, MOY, and EOY. All data from literacy
	and curriculum benchmarks are analyzed at the end of every window and used to make
	future instructional decisions. Data is also analyzed at the district level to identify
	trends across the parish. School support is designed based on these trends and
	individual school performance.
	Grade 3 students also take district common assessments to track progress toward
	mastery in ELA curriculum based on LEAP standards.
