The school is governed by a twenty-four member Board of Trustees.

COLLEGE COUNSELING PHILOSOPHY

Sayre School's college counseling process understands that colleges and universities have individual personalities, just as each of our students has a unique and distinctive character. We aim to identify for each student the right "type" of school using factors such as size, cost, distance from home, region of the country, quality of specific academic programs, social climate, and community settings, and to help students gain admittance to colleges where they will grow and thrive.

ACADEMIC PROGRAM SPECIFICS

- Sayre School does not provide class rank due to small class sizes
- GPA is weighted +.05 for Honors and +1.0 AP courses (all other courses are considered college preparatory)
- AP classes have selective enrollment based on criteria determined by each department
- Logistical constraints of the schedule may limit opportunities for some AP and Honors classes in the junior and senior years
- Most APs are not open to students until their junior and senior years
- Students enrolled in an AP course must sit for the exam
- 21 AP classes offered
- 24 Carnegie credits required to graduate

LOCAL UNIVERSITY AND ONLINE COURSE OFFERINGS

Students may take online courses for credit through Brigham Young University or in person through Transylvania University and the University of Kentucky. While students are given credit for successfully-completed courses, grades they earn are not included on their Sayre School transcript nor calculated into their GPA.
