1. 3. ELAC/PBIS - PBIS has implemented new things for Minga (teachers can redeem points in the classroom), each week PBIS announces who has the highest Minga points, first ELAC meeting was this week, several EL students specifically came to OHS because of EL environment/support, 60 new EL students came to OHS in first two weeks of school, a new ELD class was opened along with 5 other classes, diverse group of students, concerns that students did not enroll initially due to not feeling safe with news about ICE coming to schools

J Snyder also mentioned that Health Academy also speaks in EL classes, helps students feel welcome and engaged

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- SSC members should read through this document in the next month, identify how we can work to support ALL students. M Buljan will also enable this so that members can comment.

J McKinney asked if some of the terminology referring to student groups was districtwide, and if there was a way to shift to person-first language for these groups.

M Buljan noted that this was districtwide.

J McKinney wondered if we could change some of the language in the goals when referring to student groups.

M Buljan said he was open to that.
