The students of Dutch Clark Digital engaged in a Suicide Awareness Walk to bring attention to this important matter by their presence.




CONSTITUTION DAY

Student Privacy & Accommodation Policy

On Tuesday, September 23, 2025, the Pueblo District 60 Board of Education repealed Policy AC-E-3, Guidelines Regarding the Support of Students Who are Transgender and Gender Non-Conforming, and replaced it with Policy JRD, Student Privacy & Accommodation. This change simplifies the district's accommodation process while ensuring that Pueblo D60 continues to support all students, including our transgender and gender non-conforming students, consistent with federal and state law. Please note that the language in Policy JRD was taken from Policy AC-E-3 and was slightly revised for clarity.
