Jesuit High School, established by the Society of Jesus in 1956, is a Catholic, college-preparatory, four-year secondary school. JHS serves students of all religious faiths. It is located on the west side of Portland, Ore., which has a growing metropolitan population of approximately two million people.

Edison's academically challenging curriculum follows the state of Oregon's graduation requirements. Though Edison is independent of Jesuit, a collaborative relationship exists between the two schools. Jesuit students with learning differences may qualify to enroll in 1-3 classes per year at Edison. Edison classes are included on Jesuit transcripts and count toward Jesuit diploma requirements.
