Sixth Grade

English Language Arts with Ms. Carter:

This week in Readers Workshop students are working on building their reading stamina and reading skills. Ask your student what they are reading!

In Writers Workshop we are wrapping up our first writing assignment: a Personal Narrative (i.e. a short story about a memory they have!).

MN Studies with Ms. Atchison and Mr. Kareem:

Social studies in 6th grade is Minnesota Studies. We start the year learning about the geography of our state, and then learn about Minnesota's Indigenous Nations. After that, we will learn about Minnesota's fur trade, treaty making, and our transition into statehood. Students will learn about Minnesota's industries and our contribution to the United States' Civil War. We will finish the year learning about various social movements that happened in our state. We use the Northern Lights curriculum from the Minnesota Historical Society.

Science with Ms. Atkinson:

In 6th grade science, we started our year learning about science safety and our routines in middle school science. Now we are in a unit about light. Students watched video about a one-way mirror and found examples of the same phenomenon at home. We will be moving into learning how we see light while practicing designing investigations and developing models of science phenomena.

Seventh Grade

Social Studies with Ms. Atchison and Ms. Newman:

In American Studies, 7th graders have begun thinking and doing the work of historians. We have been focusing on what history is, why it is important, and which stories are being told. Currently, we are studying the US Civil War and exploring multiple perspectives as we learn.

Our goals for the year include understanding absent narratives, multiple perspectives, researching primary and secondary sources to learn what happened and its impact on us today.

Eighth Grade

Science with Ms. Atkinson:

Eighth grade students are learning about collisions and contact forces in science class. We are isolating variables that create more damage in collisions. Then we will create force diagrams and brainstorming ways to reduce damage in collisions.

Coding

Coding with Ms. Atkinson:

In coding class, we are working on two different programming platforms: Swift Playgrounds and Code.org. Students are learning the basics of sequencing commands into functions. We also are using different apps to show their learning like Keynote, Pages, Clips, and Padlet.

Counselor Corner & Mental Health Corner

Hello, it is hard to believe it is already the end of September! We hope your middle schoolers are settling into their school routine.

School Counselors have been going into 6-8 classrooms during quarter 1 and focusing on the topics of bullying prevention, harassment, mental health, coping strategies, how to access support for mental health or stress related concerns and suicide prevention.

Please ask your middle schooler what they have been learning.

Additionally, throughout the school year, middle schoolers may see potentially stressful situations on the news or hear about traumatic events in different communities or neighborhoods. If your child is feeling stressed or worried and needs to talk with a School Counselor or Social Worker, please don't hesitate to reach out.


