What:

TREP provides 2 years of FREE college tuition, fees, and up to \$300 per semester for books at UCCS, CSU–Pueblo, Metro State, or PPSC.

Eligibility Requirements:

District 11 graduates who completed at least one qualifying course during their senior year and are pursuing a degree in teaching or school counseling.

Next Steps:

- Complete the TREP Interest Application.
- Apply and get accepted to a D11 TREP partner college or university: UCCS, CSUP, Metro, or PPSC.
- Complete the FAFSA or CASFA.
- Review financial aid offers.
- Submit proof of eligibility (college transcript with qualifying course).
- Meet with college advisor and register for college classes.
- TREP slots are announced in mid-May.

TREP slots are limited; applicants should also have a backup postsecondary plan.

Are you a high school senior interested in becoming a teacher or school counselor? **Check out TREP!**

TREP is an extended concurrent enrollment program that allows students to remain a D11 student while attending college for free for two years.

★ *Students must take a qualifying course from the list below during their senior year to qualify. **Courses** marked with a ★ are taught by D11 instructors at D11 schools and may vary each year—check with your counselor or Future Center staff for the most up-to-date options.*
