### 1884 — Groton School Founded

Endicott Peabody founds Groton School in 1884. Fannie Peabody marries Endicott Peabody in 1885.

















### 1910s — The "Saving Graces"

Integral to the functioning of the school in the early twentieth century are the "Saving Graces": lunch lady Miss Cram and nurses Miss Burnett, "Mither," and Mme. MacMurray.





Women begin teaching music lessons and playing in the school orchestra.









### 1932 — Groton's First Woman Teacher

Betsy Peabody, daughter of Fannie and Endicott Peabody, becomes Groton's first woman teacher in 1932. She starts teaching science and later spearheads a progressive remedial reading

## 1971 — Trustees Approve Coeducation

The Board of Trustees approves the Committee on Coeducation's recommendation that the school go coed.



# 1973 — Girls' Dorms Construction Starts

The Board of Trustees approve the final plans for the remodeling of the Hundred House Service Wing.



# 1975 — Girls Arrive at Groton School
