Creighton Prep's student body matriculated from 84 different schools: 54 public schools and 30 Catholic schools. Diversity among the student body is valued, and students come from a wide range of socioeconomic and cultural backgrounds. In order to promote a demographic that is reflective of the city, summer and weekend academic programs are offered to underrepresented students to prepare them for a high school education at Prep.

## GRADUATE AT GRADUATION

Creighton Preparatory School is a part of a network of 90 Jesuit schools and 28 Jesuit colleges and universities throughout the United States. Our shared blueprint, “The Profile of the Graduate at Graduation” identifies the characteristics of our graduates upon their graduation: open to growth, intellectually competent, religious, loving and committed to doing justice. The programs at Creighton Prep are intended to challenge our students through a vital stage of their personal development. Graduates of Creighton Prep are prepared for higher education and life.

## DUAL ENROLLMENT

Students may earn college credit if they decide to co-register for a class through dual enrollment. We offer dual enrollment opportunities through University of Nebraska Omaha, Creighton University and Metropolitan Community College for the following courses: AP African American Studies, AP Biology, AP Calculus AB, AP Calculus BC, AP Computer Science A, AP Language and Composition, AP Latin, AP English Literature and Composition, AP Macroeconomics, AP Microeconomics, AP Photography, 2-D Art and Design, AP Physics I, AP Physics C, AP Psychology, AP Spanish Language and Culture, AP Spanish Literature and Culture, AP Statistics, AP Drawing, AP US Government and Politics, AP US History, Calculus I, College Composition, First Principles of Philosophy, Independent Study Art, Intro to Coding, Information Security, Linear Algebra and Differential Equations, Multivariable Calculus, and World Religions.

## GRADING SCALE

- GPA is weighted as follows:
  - Advanced courses receive an added 0.25 GPA point.
  - Honors courses receive an added 0.50 GPA point.
  - AP courses receive an added 1.0 GPA point.
- Only grades earned at Prep are calculated into the GPA.

The percentage grade scale equates to GPA as follows:

## PREP COMMUNITY

Creighton Preparatory School takes a holistic view of education, to include nurturing the spiritual, physical, intellectual and artistic gifts each student brings to campus. The rigorous curriculum, community service and campus ministry programs, as well as co-curricular and athletic offerings, focus on educating young men of competence, conscience and compassion.

## UNIQUE PROGRAMMING

- + LOYOLA SCHOLARS:** Loyola Scholars is a year-round, three-year program serving middle school sixth through eighth grade males in the Omaha metro area who are academically talented, have leadership potential and whose households have significant financial need. After successful completion of all three years, scholars earn a full scholarship to Creighton Prep for their freshman year that is renewable each successive year based on academic and other standards. The first cohort of Loyola Scholars graduated from Creighton Prep in 2023.
- + TOMORROW LABS:** Creighton Prep provides intentional space for innovation and creativity using advanced technologies. The space, equipment and staffing allow for course offerings in innovative technologies, robotics and computer programming. Among the top labs in Nebraska at the high school level, the ToMorrow Labs is a place where learning happens in an environment of collaboration, creativity and problem solving. In addition, co-curricular clubs and teams use the lab space. With emerging technology and rising student demand, the ToMorrow Labs was recently updated to include additional space for learning and robotics, a server farm and a virtual network.
- + CAMPUS MINISTRY AND RETREAT PROGRAM:** Spiritual formation of our young men is at the core of the Creighton Prep mission. Retreat ministry has a privileged role in Jesuit institutions, and our students engage in a rich set of retreats over their four years. These retreats provide students with opportunities to examine their lives in a reflective and spiritual way with over 100 juniors and seniors serving as retreat leaders.
- + JAY SQUADS:** Jay Squads are composed of small groups of 3-4 freshman students intentionally paired with upperclassman leaders. They meet monthly with a goal of creating multi-dimensional relationships within the Prep community. The squads serve as a resource for all of the student's experiences at Prep and are designed to foster relationships, provide academic support, create a network for activities and develop leadership skills.
- + SERVICE AND SOCIAL JUSTICE:** Prep students are called to be men for others. Service components are embedded into Prep's curriculum and retreat programming. In addition, Prep offers multiple clubs and activities that include service and community engagement.
- + ATHLETICS:** Creighton Prep has a strong athletic tradition that contributes to the holistic education of our students. We offer NSAA sanctioned sports in basketball, baseball, bowling, cross country, football, golf, soccer, swimming and diving, tennis, track and wrestling. In addition, we offer four club sports: hockey, lacrosse, powerlifting and trap shooting. Our intramural program allows students to participate in athletics in a recreational manner and foster friendships. Creighton Prep is an 11-time NSAA Cup winner, recognized for having the most successful interscholastic activities program in the state. We have also received the Omaha World-Herald All Sports Championship title 24 times, including 18 of the past 25 years.
