The average class size is twelve. ## SCHOLARSHIFT®

ScholarShift is a required program in grades 10-11. Students “learn by doing” and by reflecting on the experience. Activities can include service learning, hands on creating and making, internships and research. The capstone experience (senior year) includes an invitation to self-design an education experience.
