SCHOOL-PARENT COMPACT

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class and to observe classroom activities, as follows:

Parents are free to contact administration and teachers in order to volunteer in school events and observe classroom activities. The PTA is highly involved in school activities as well.
