## COMMUNITY

Located in Broomfield, Colorado, Legacy is a public high school for grades 9 - 12. The Adams 12 Five Star School District serves over 34,746 students. It is located northwest of Denver in an economically diverse suburb.

## PHILOSOPHY

Legacy High School was founded in 2000 as a secondary school based on the belief that all students will be provided with the opportunities and support needed to achieve academic excellence.

## SPECIAL PROGRAMS

### Legacy 2000 (L2k)

The four-year course objectives include career and technology exploration, research practice, job shadowing, and a final project presentation.
