Mission

Academic Program

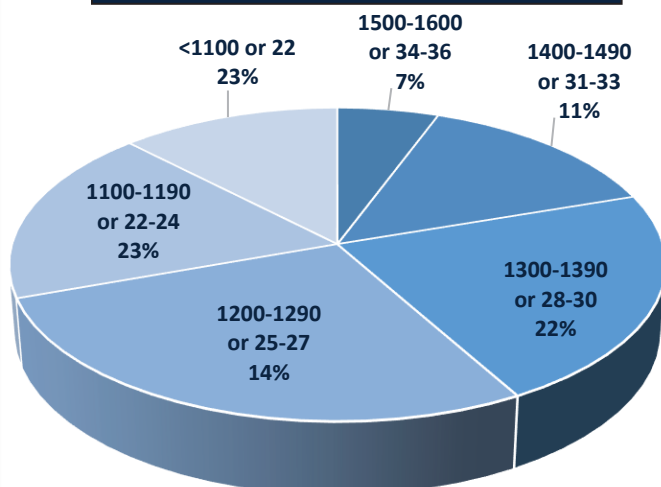
- Christian Brothers Academy engages students in a rigorous liberal arts curriculum.
- All courses, no matter the level, are academically rigorous and promote high-level analytical thinking.
- Students must enroll in at least six classes per year, while most students complete seven classes per year.
- Gaining entrance to honors, accelerated and/or AP courses is predicated on earning a qualifying final grade in the prerequisite course. All students enrolled in an AP course must sit for the corresponding AP exam.
- 100% of students successfully earned the Bloomberg Finance Fundamentals Certificate after completing the Bloomberg course.
- Linear Algebra & Differential Equations, Anatomy & Physiology, Business, and Economics are demanding courses offered to seniors and should be regarded as college-level courses.
- Students earning below 70 as a final average are required to take a summer course for remediation.

Signature Programs

- The **Brother Michael Dwyer, FSC Scholars Program** is comprised of a cohort of students in the top 10% of their class who during their junior and senior years participate in focused research in a selected area of study.
- The **Christian Service Program** requires each student to complete minimum of 50 hours of service to those in need over their 4 years of high school. Seniors particularly committed to service have an opportunity to enroll in a **Christian Service Class** where they perform weekly volunteer service at a site of their choosing.
- The **Peer Ministry Program** selects 30 seniors to serve as "GURU's," or big brothers, to members of the freshman class. The GURU's lead weekly meetings with small groups of freshmen to help foster their personal, spiritual, academic, and social growth.

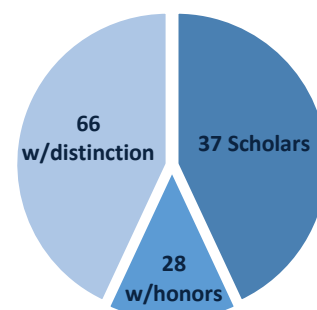
2025 SAT/ACT Score Averages

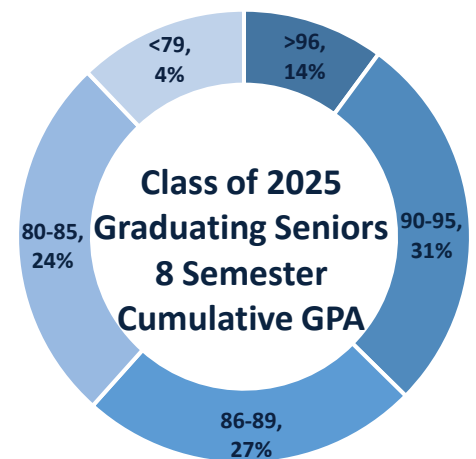
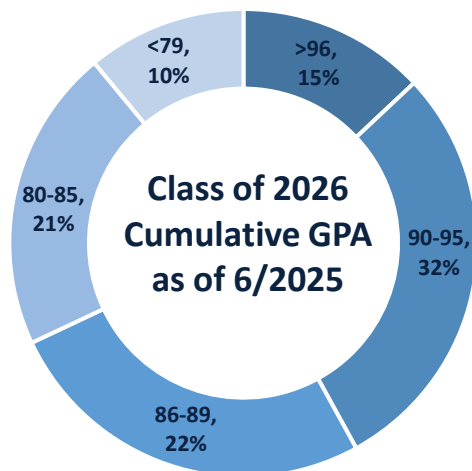
AP Analysis – 2024-2025 School Year
