School Organization

Leavenworth High School runs on a standard four-year graduation curriculum. Enrollment at LHS averages about 1300 students. For over 100 years, the school had been accredited by the North Central Association of Secondary Schools and is currently accredited by the Kansas State Department of Education Quality Performance Accreditation.

Leavenworth High School students may enroll in courses that are either a semester or a year in length. The school days are based on a seven-period day in which a student attends all seven academic classes and a non-credit advisory period each day. Students earn a half credit per semester per class, and 23 credits are required to graduate. Seniors have the option of graduating at the end of the first semester or having a reduced schedule for the second semester.

Pioneer Career Center

Thanks to a partnership with Kansas City Kansas Community College, USD 453 serves as a host site for the Pioneer Career Center. The campus enhances local access to career and technical instruction by giving students the opportunity to explore career paths in a hands-on environment. Pioneer Career Center credit may be used toward an Associate's degree at KCKCC or other accepting institutions while also qualifying for high school credit.

Faculty

The teaching staff at Leavenworth High School is highly educated, some having graduated from a university or college from around the world. Approximately sixty percent hold at least a master's degree.

Curriculum

Leavenworth High School currently offers a wide range of courses to meet student needs to include college preparatory, business, vocational, and special education programs. Honors English, Honors Algebra II, Honors Geometry, and Honors Biology are offered to increase academic rigor but are not given weighted credit. English Composition I and English Composition II, College Algebra, as well as several of the drafting courses, may be taken for concurrent credit (college and high school) but are not weighted.

Advanced Placement

The AP level courses currently offered at the high school include Biology, Chemistry, Physics 2, Calculus AB, Precalculus, English Language and Composition, English Literature and Composition, European History, Psychology, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History, Art and Design, and Art History. These courses are given weighted credit for cumulative GPA and class rank. Certain courses may be taken for concurrent credit (college and high school) through Kansas City Kansas Community College. *Weighted credit is issued for other national programs (i.e., IB and Cambridge). Leavenworth High School has had numerous AP Scholars of Distinction and a National AP Scholar.

Grade Point Average and Class Rank

Leavenworth High School has implemented a weighted grading system. Weighted grades are awarded for Advanced Placement courses on the following basis: A (5.0), B (4.0), C (3.0), D (1.0), and F (0.0). All other classes are based on a 4-3-2-1 system. Rank in class is figured on a cumulative GPA for all classes. GPA is computed by the total number of units attempted.

College Admissions Testing

Leavenworth High School has been consistently at or above the national ACT average the past several years. The state of Kansas provides ACT testing to all members of the junior class. Leavenworth High School has had a student earn a perfect 36 composite score and has had numerous State ACT Scholars. In addition, Leavenworth High has had a number of National Merit commended students, semi-finalists, and finalists during its history.
