



From the Desk of the Superintendent

Every year, schools are tasked with building a budget. On the surface, that may sound like rows of numbers and spreadsheets, but it's really about something much bigger, it's about preparing for the future. A budget is not simply a plan for the present; it is an investment in years to come, ensuring that Lakeview is positioned for long-term success.

In a very real sense, our students are doing the same thing. Each day they make choices, what classes to take, what activities to pursue, what friendships to nurture. The students asked lots of great questions and learned how to be more aware of electrical dangers at home and school. It was a fun and educational experience for everyone!





We are off to a wonderful start at St. John's Lutheran School this year! So much has happened in our first month! A wonderful time was had at our first parent hot lunch; our grandparents were invited for a special chapel and pizza lunch; the book selection in our i55 Book Fair was enjoyed; and Parent-Teacher conferences were held. On September 9th, the Middle Room and Big Room were given a demonstration by the Cornhusker Public Power District, emphasizing the importance of safety when using and being around electricity. The Pre-school and Pre-K students have been busy getting the hang of their new school routines and reviewing and practicing colors.
