As part of our Halloween fun on October 31, we will have two Halloween Parades along the driveway behind our school weather permitting.






THIRD GRADE READING GUARANTEE

Ohio's Third Grade Reading Guarantee strives to identify students in kindergarten through third grade who are behind in reading. Schools provide help and support to make sure students are on track for reading success by the end of third grade. As part of the requirements, all children in grades K-3 are given a reading diagnostic assessment to determine if they have met the standards for the previous school year and are on track for reading at their present grade level. Students who are deemed not on track will be placed on a Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan (RIMP). Under Ohio law, a RIMP must now continue throughout the student's K-12 academic career until the student is reading proficiently for their current grade level (a score of 700 or higher on Ohio's State Test for English language arts). For more detailed information on the Third Grade Guarantee, visit the Ohio Department of Education's website at www.education.ohio.gov. Third graders will take the state ELA assessment on October 21 & 22, and will have a second opportunity in the spring.
