



Graduation Requirements

- Earn a total of 225 credits
- Pass specific subject requirements
 - English: 40 credits (4 years)
 - History/Social Science: 30 credits (3 years)
 - Math: 30 credits (3 years)
 - Laboratory Science: 20 credits (2 years)
 - Physical Science: 10 credits
 - Life Science: 10 credits
 - Fine Art or Language Other Than English: 10 credits (1 year)
 - Career Technical Education (CTE): 10 credits (1 year)
 - Physical Education: 20 credits (2 years)
 - Health: 5 credits (1 semester)
 - Electives: 60 credits


* Remember, requirements for UC/CSU schools differ and often require more credits in certain subjects.



Credit Recovery

If your student is missing credits in certain subjects, they do have options to recover those credits before graduation.

- ➤ APEX
 - Students were referred by counselors based on academic progress
- Skyline Concurrent Enrollment
- Fee-based programs outside of our district (i.e. Silicon Valley High School and BYU)





UC & CSU Eligibility Requirements ("A-G")

These requirements are for public schools in CA, outside schools may have different requirements. Be sure to do your research before applying and touring schools.

- a. History/Social Science 2 years (1 year World History & 1 year U.S. History or 1 semester U.S. History and 1 semester American Government)
- b. English 4 years
- c. Math 3 years* (Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II or MC1, MC2, MC3)
- d. Lab Science 2 years* (1 year life & 1 year physical)
- e. Language Other Than English 2 years* (same language)
- f. Visual & Performing Arts 1 year
- g. Elective 1 year

*additional years of subject recommended

Must earn a "C" grade or better both semesters and coursework must be CP or higher

Freshman: Testing Requirements

The California State University (CSU) no longer uses ACT or SAT examinations in determining admission eligibility for all CSU campuses. If accepted to a CSU campus, ACT or SAT test scores can be used as one of the measures to place students in the proper mathematics and written communication courses. Exam requirement

UC will not consider SAT or ACT test scores when making admissions decisions or awarding scholarships. If you choose to submit test scores as part of your application, they may be used as an alternative method of fulfilling minimum requirements for eligibility or for course placement after you enroll.

*Private/Out of State colleges and universities testing may vary, it's encouraged to do research on specific freshmen admission req based on the individual institution.

tuition savings for Western students.

Through WUE, eligible students can choose from hundreds of undergraduate programs outside their home state, and pay no more than 150 percent of that institution's resident tuition rate.

What is the TAG program?

Six UC campuses offer the Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program for California community college students who meet specific requirements.

By participating in TAG, you may receive early review of your academic records, early admission notification and specific guidance about major preparation and general education coursework.



Other Post High School Options

It is important for students to understand that most of their post high school options require a high school diploma including, Community College, Trade Schools, Unions Programs and the military.

Trades & T.I.P.S.



There are <u>453 labor/trade unions</u> in the greater bay area.

Most Trade Unions Require (some will require more and some less)

- > Must be 18 yrs old in CA
- A high school diploma or GED certificate (some require a specific grade in Algebra)
- > A valid driver's license
- > Pass an aptitude test
- Background check/Drug Test
- Birth Certificate/SS Card



Once requirements are met, applicant are placed into a pool for companies to hire. When joining a union applicants start as apprentices with specific required on the job training hours and classes 2-4 hours a week





State certified joint apprenticeship training program lasting about 20 weeks, with classes twice a week from 6-9pm

Helpful Application Tips for Completing the FAFSA



- Complete the FAFSA before California's priority deadline of March 2, 2026
- Apply for financial aid regardless of income or assets
- Include at least one college in California, even if the student plans to study out-of-state
- Keep a copy of the final Confirmation page, FAFSA Submission Summary, and all documents used to complete the FAFSA
- Check CSAC's WebGrants for Students website 10 days after the FAFSA/CADAA is submitted (mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov)
- Keep checking your email for important notices (Check junk and spam folders!)







Your Student May Be Eligible for a CalKIDS Scholarship (worth up to \$1,500)

➤ Visit CalKIDS.org

As a California public school student, your child may be eligible to receive a CalKIDS Scholarship of \$500 to \$1,500 for college or career training. Funded by the State of California, a CalKIDS Scholarship can be used for qualified college and career training expenses such as tuition and fees, books and supplies, and computer equipment. Checking a student's eligibility and claiming a CalKIDS Scholarship is quick and easy; it only takes a minute. All you need is your child's 10-digit Statewide Student Identifier (SSID), which can be found through StudentVUE. For more information, to check your child's eligibility, and claim their scholarship, visit <u>CalKIDS.org.</u>

Transcripts

ALL STUDENTS MUST REQUEST TRANSCRIPT THROUGH PARCHMENT.COM

A high school transcript is a complete record of academic achievement, courses taken, credits earned and grades received during HS.

A student will need to access their transcript for:

- College Applications
- College Transfer Applications
- Course Planning
- Scholarship Applications
- Job Applications (some)
- Apprenticeship Applications (ie. union apps)



Official Transcripts:

This version is required for formal applications.

These are authenticated by the school with a signature, embossed and sealed in an envelope or delivered via secured online platform, sent directly from school.

Unofficial Transcripts:

This version is usually for personal use, self evaluation, course planning, car insurance etc.

No signature, or ensignia. Usually a plain printed version.

* There is a link on the front page of TN website to parchment. See Mrs. Christensen if you need code.

Terra Nova Senior Awards

Senior Awards: Students must meet certain academic criteria in to qualify for most awards.

Scholar Awards: In the spring semester (Apr), seniors will be able to apply for \$\$\$ scholar awards so should be on the lookout for the applications.

What Now...?



- Monitor academic progress towards graduation
- "Senioritis" is real, students must continue to work towards graduation, teachers don't pass students, "just because they are seniors"
- > Plan for post-grad pathways: i.e. 2/4 yr schools, trade school, careers, etc.
- > Encourage student to communicate with teachers and counselor
- Always check emails, newsletter, website and social media to stay updated on the latest updates about graduation, prom and other senior events.
