Overview

The Walworth Barbour American International School (AIS) in Israel was founded in 1958 and is a private, independent, nonprofit, coeducational day school serving students from preschool to grade 12. AIS offers an American college preparatory curriculum leading to a U.S. High School Diploma. School admissions are non-selective and AIS currently enrolls 450 students, including 182 students in the high school.



Faculty

The high school faculty includes 35 members, with 26 holding Master's Degrees and 3 holding Doctoral Degrees. The student-to-faculty ratio is approximately 5:1.



Academics

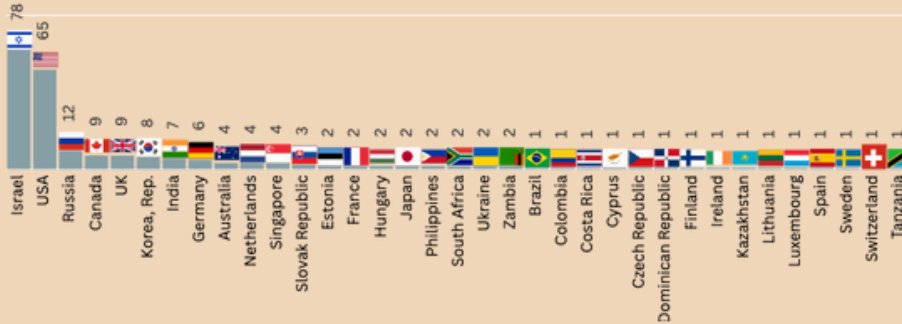
- AIS offers 70 unique credit-bearing courses for students in grades 9-12.

- In addition to their regular classes, all students participate in Advisory and iBlock sessions which focus on their social-emotional development and academic success.



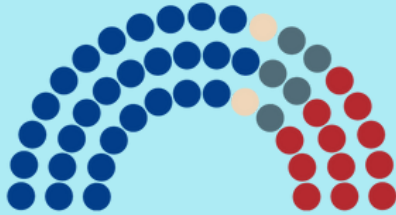


Passports Represented

- Military Service - 25.53%



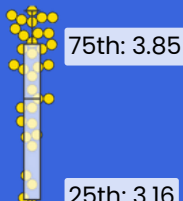
Grades & Academics

Cumulative GPA Distribution



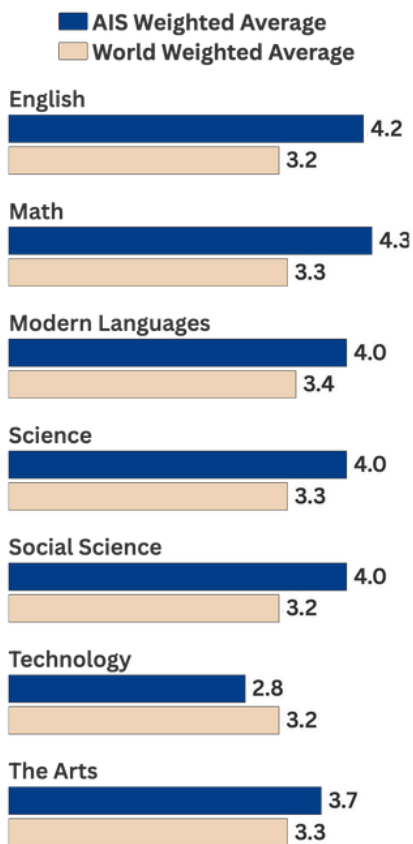

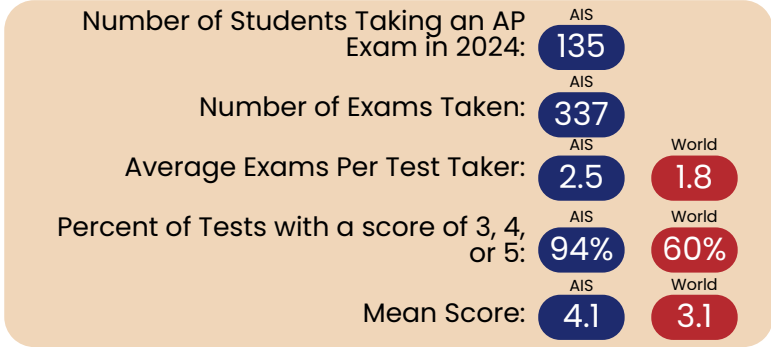
