What is the purpose of the plan? This plan explains how Central High School will provide opportunities to improve family engagement to support student learning. How is the plan revised? Parents and family members are invited to attend the annual FACE Forums scheduled at convenient times to review and revise this plan, the schoolwide plan, the school-parent compact, and the family engagement budget. We also distribute an annual survey to ask parents for their suggestions on the plan and use of funds for family engagement. All parent feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year.

Who is the plan for? All students participating in the Title I, Part A program, and their families are encouraged and invited to fully participate in the opportunities described in this plan. Central High will provide an opportunity for the full participation of parents and family members with limited English, with disabilities, and of migratory children. The Neglected and Delinquent Residential Facilities in the district are included in the family engagement correspondence and activities.

Where is the plan available? The plan is included in the Parent and Family Engagement Guidebook distributed during the 1st school semester. It is also available in the parent resource center, front office, media center, office of the counselor, and posted on the school website.

Family Engagement

Central High School will take the following measures to promote and support parents and family members as an important foundation of the school in order to strengthen the school and reach our school goals. We will...

- **Ensure** that all information related to school and parent programs, meetings, and other activities is posted on the school website parent page and published in both English and Spanish as needed.
- **Communicate** with all families and the community on a regular basis about school meetings/events via ParentSquare the district/school text messaging system, flyers, *The Charger Connection* electronic newsletter, Facebook & Twitter, and phone calls as appropriate.
- **Conduct** staff development on family engagement practices and effective strategies for staff to work with parents as equal partners and invite our parents to assist in developing trainings and presentations.
- **Partner** with Miller Middle School and other programs to help parents help their children transition to high school.
- **Provide** necessary materials and handouts at meetings and activities to help parents work with their children to improve achievement.
- **Listen** and respond to parents' requests for additional support for family engagement from workshops, surveys, and parent meetings.
- **Submit** parent feedback about any part of the Title I Schoolwide Plan that parents feel is not satisfactory to the goals for student and school academic achievement to the local Title I office.
