What is Impact Aid? **1**

Impact Aid is federal funding that supports school districts like ours with students from military families or families living on federal land. Since federal property doesn't pay local taxes, our schools receive less local funding. Impact Aid provides the support our schools need to maintain quality programs, teachers, and learning materials.

Why is Impact Aid Important for Travis Unified?

Because families living on federal property, such as Travis Air Force Base, don't pay local property taxes, Travis Unified receives less local funding than many other districts. Impact Aid helps make up for this loss by supporting essential programs, paying staff, providing classroom materials, and maintaining our schools.

How Can Parents Help? **3**

Parents play a vital role by completing and returning the Impact Aid Survey each year. Accurate and timely forms ensure the district receives the full funding it qualifies for. If surveys are not returned, the district risks losing funding that supports programs, staff, and resources. Completing the form directly benefits your child's education.
