An Effective Compact:

- ◆ **Links** goals to the school improvement plan.
- ◆ **Focuses** on student learning skills.
- ◆ **Describes** how teachers will help students develop those skills using high-quality instruction.
- ◆ **Shares** strategies parents can use at home.
- ◆ **Explains** how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress.
- ◆ **Describes** opportunities for parents to volunteer, observe, and participate in the classroom.

Reading

- ◆ 2nd Grade - Increase percent of students achieving a grade level appropriate Lexile to 65% or higher as measured by the Star 360 Assessment.

Math

Increase student performance by 10% in Numbers and Operations as measured by the Star 360 Assessment.

- ◆ Kindergarten - recognize numbers, count quantities of objects, compare sets of objects and represent quantities with numerals up to 20.
- ◆ 1st Grade - Understand addition and subtraction within 20.
- ◆ 2nd Grade - Build fluency with addition and subtraction.

- ◆ Provide specific strategies and activities that are targeted to reading fluency and math skills using newsletters, school websites and other resources.

Reading

Increase percent of students achieving a grade level appropriate Lexile to 65% as measured by STAR 360 assessments.
