

## At-Risk Coding Roles and Responsibilities

The principal/AP is responsible for ensuring that the data is gathered, verified, and submitted to the Registrar for entry promptly.

| 2. is in <b>grades 7-12</b> and <b>did not maintain an average equivalent to 70 in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum</b> during a semester in the preceding or current school year, or is not maintaining such an average in two or more subjects in the foundation curriculum in the current semester                       | Counselor  |  | The student is not failing more than one core subject in the year the student was identified and in the following year. (2 years – current and next year)                      |
| 3. <b>did not perform satisfactorily</b> on a state assessment, <i>and</i> who has not in the previous or current school year subsequently performed on a State assessment at least <b>110 percent of the level of satisfactory performance on that instrument</b><br><b>Note: Ask PEIMS to create the report in Student Reports on 110%</b> | Academic Specialist<br><br>HS: 504/Testing Coordinator | <a href="#">TISD At-Risk Flowchart</a> | Scored at least 110% of the state's passing standard for the subtest previously failed. (Ex.: Failed 3rd grade Reading, must pass 4th grade Reading at 110% of passing score.) |
| 4. is in <b>grades PK-3</b> and <b>did not perform satisfactorily on a readiness test or assessment instrument</b> administered during the current school year;  | Reading Specialist                                     | <a href="#">TISD At-Risk Flowchart</a> | End of the current school year.  |
| 5. is <b>pregnant</b> or is a <b>parent</b>  | Counselor  |  | Individual cases when the student is no longer pregnant or a parent.   |
| 6. has been placed in an alternative education program during the <b>preceding or current school year (DAEP)</b>   | AP   |  | End of the school year after placement. (2 years – current and next year)  |
| 7. has been <b>expelled</b> during the <b>preceding or current school year</b> ;   | AP   |  | End of the school year after placement. (2 years – current and next year)  |
| 8. is currently on <b>parole, probation, deferred prosecution, or other conditional release</b>  | AP   |  | End of the school year after placement. (2 years – current and next year)  |
| 9. was previously reported as a <b>dropout on PEIMS</b>  | Campus Leadership/Counselor                            |  | Upon graduation from High School.  |
| 10. is a <b>Limited English Proficient</b> student.  | EB Specialist  |  | Exited from the program by the LPAC (Language Proficiency Assessment Committee)  |
| 11. is in the <b>custody, care of, or has been referred to the Department of Family and Protective Services</b>  | Counselor  |  | At the end of the current school year.   |
| 12. is <b>Homeless</b> according to 42 USC 11434 (a).  | Counselor  |  | At the end of the current school year.   |
| 13. resided the previous year or resides current year in a residential placement facility IN THE DISTRICT  | Student Support Specialist                             |  | At the end of the school year, after the placement has ended. (2 years – current and next year)  |
| 14. has been <b>incarcerated</b> or has a <b>parent</b> or guardian who has been <b>incarcerated</b> , within the lifetime of the student, in a penal institution (any jail facility)  | Counselor  |  | Upon graduation from High School   |
| 15. is enrolled in a school district or open-enrollment charter school, or a campus of a school district or open-enrollment charter school, that is designated as a dropout recovery school  | Counselor  |  | Upon graduation from High School   |
| 16. is a chronically absent student, as defined by TEC, §48.009;   | Campus Leadership                                      |  | At the end of the current school year.   |
| 17. is required to attend school under TEC, §25.085, is not exempt under TEC, §25.086, and fails to attend school without excuse for 10 or more days or parts of days within a six-month period in the same school year;   | Campus Leadership                                      |  | At the end of the current school year.   |
