

CROCKETT GOES 6-0 IN VOLLEYBALL INVITATIONAL; SET FOR DYER COUNTY REMATCH TUESDAY

Laman's crew now travels to Newbern Tuesday to battle Dyer County, currently 32-7 on the season and winner of another Saturday tournament this weekend. The Lady Choctaws are 11-0 in District 13 and will play at Collierville Monday night before entertaining Crockett Tuesday.

"I'm so proud of this team for their hard work, teamwork, and energy all day long Saturday," Laman said of his Lady Cavs.

GOLF: Three Cavalier golfers – Jack Shaver and George Randall for the boys and Rachel Crossnoe for the girls – will be playing as individuals Monday in the Region Tournament at The Farms in Dyersburg, trying to earn berths in the TSSAA State Tournament. Each will play an 18-hole round Monday. Only the team champion and the three best scores not by members of the champion team advance to State competition.

SOCCER: Crockett's Lady Cavs take their best shot at getting the highest seed they can manage in the upcoming district tournament Monday night when they travel to Dyersburg for a 5:30 matchup. Coach Carli Branson's crew only has one district defeat (to South Gibson in a 2-1 match), while the Lady Trojans haven't yet dropped a district contest and own a 4-3 win over South Gibson.

In about 10 hours of time Saturday, Crockett County's volleyball team tuned up for its big district rematch with Dyer County Tuesday in the best possible manner.

Coach Andrew Laman's Lady Cavaliers swept through their own annual invitational tournament, winning all six of their matches without losing a single set of the 12 they played.

And it wasn't like Crockett (now 24-6 on the season) loaded the event with a bunch of walkovers. Among the Lady Cavs' victims Saturday were Lexington (twice), which currently leads the District 12 standings with an 11-1 record; Trinity Christian Academy, annually one of the top teams in the area; and Brighton, a team that already has 18 victories this fall.

In order, Crockett took down Gibson County, Lexington, TCA, Middleton, Brighton, and then Lexington again in the championship match. The Lady Tigers had finished second in their pool but won their way back into the title game, but the Lady Cavs polished them off again to claim the trophy.
