Quick overview of Financial Aid

Financial Aid can cover cost for College, trade schools, and higher education including Tuition, Room & Board, Transportation, Books, Personal Expenses

Types of Financial Aid:

- Grants, Scholarships, Work Study, Loans

What do you need to complete a financial aid application:

- FSA ID - for student and parent/guardian
- Social Security Number
- Tax return -parent/guardian
- Personal Email Address

 - g. Log in with your Google account at the top



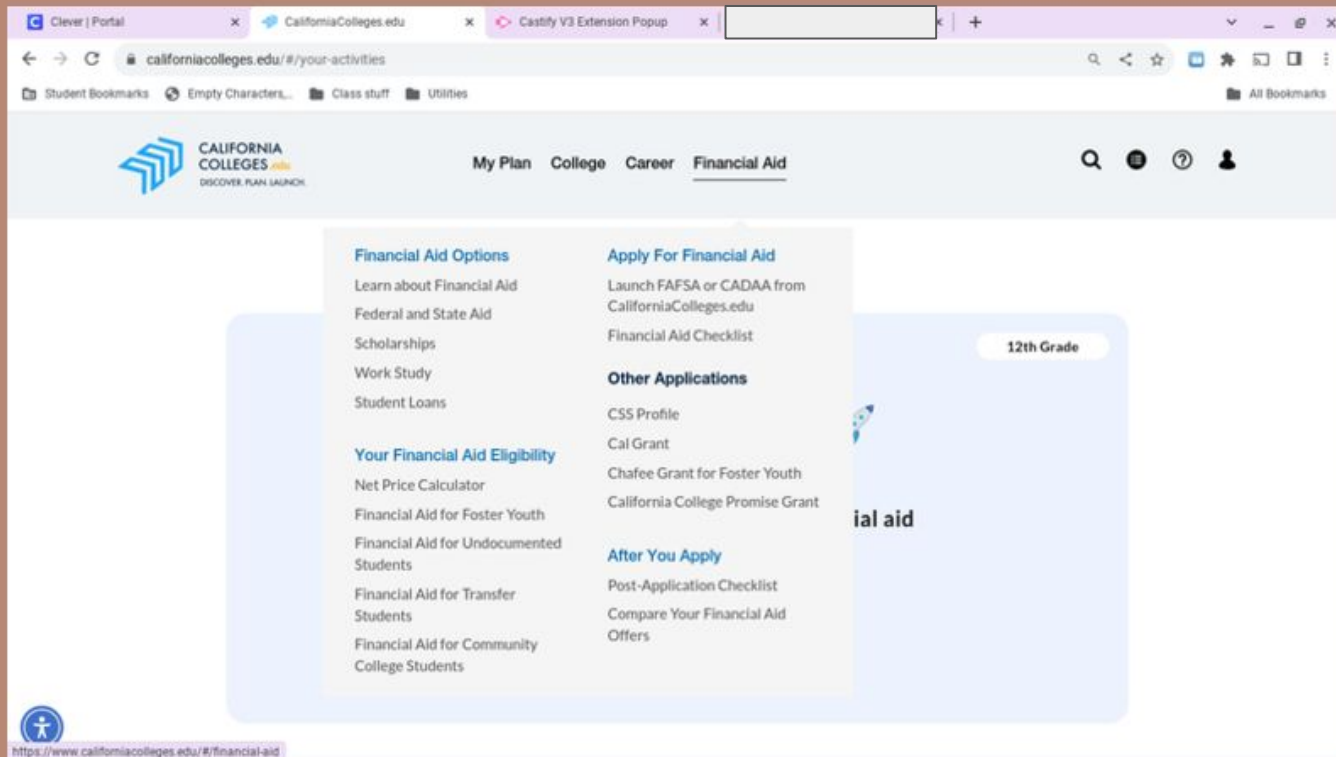

Going to college might seem like it's going to cost a lot. You're probably wondering how you'll pay for it all.

Here's some good news — there's a lot of money out there to help you pay for college. No matter what college you go to or how much money your family makes, chances are really good that you can get financial aid.

Poor grades or a late withdrawal from college courses can hurt your chances of getting financial aid. It's important to continue to make satisfactory academic progress (SAP). This means you'll need to keep a minimum college GPA set by your college, typically a 2.0. You might have taken college classes in high school. This is called dual enrollment. Those grades will be part of your permanent student record and college transcript. If you fail a college course, make sure to retake it.

You only get financial aid if you apply. Don't miss out! There are two financial aid applications:

- **FAFSA** stands for **Free Application for Federal Student Aid**.
- **CADAA** stands for the **California Dream Act Application**.
