What does it mean to be a Title I School?

The purpose of federal Title I funding is to ensure that all children have a fair and equal opportunity to obtain a high-quality education. It is part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act first passed in 1965. The act is reauthorized by Congress from time to time and often given a new name. It is currently known as the Every Student Succeeds Act. Title I funds are used to help improve academic achievement among disadvantaged students, or students who come from low-income families.

Title 1 Facts

- Nation's oldest and largest federally funded program
- Provides over \$14 billion to school systems
- Schools with large concentrations of low-income students will receive supplemental funds to assist in meeting students' educational goals
 - In LBUSD schools with 40% or more of their student body who qualify for free or reduced priced lunch qualify (school site) for Title 1 funding.

Title 1 Funding at Madison for the 2025-2026 school year
