For example, English 3 can't count toward this elective focus, but creative writing can. *See back of this page for a list of options.</p>

FULFILLMENT OF THE REQUIREMENT DOES NOT EQUAL CREDIT TOWARD THE 28 CREDITS REQUIRED TO GRADUATE.</p> <p>NOTE: Cadets required to wear a military-style uniform 1x/week. For example, Biology 1 can't count toward this elective focus, but Honors Biology 2/AP Bio can. *See back of this page for a list of options.</p>	<p align="center"><u>AP</u></p> <p>A student must take 3 AP courses. In this situation, a student can double dip and use an AP course that satisfies a graduation requirement (AP Language, for example) as an AP course counting toward the elective focus. However, the student must still graduate with a total of 28 credits. *See back of this page for a list of options.</p>	<p align="center"><u>NCAA</u></p> <p>If you are a student athlete, it is your responsibility to know course requirements established by the NCAA Clearinghouse.</p>
