About Mayfield

Founded in 1931 by the Society of the Holy Child Jesus, Mayfield Senior School is a Catholic, independent, college preparatory school for young women in grades 9-12. Students from 70 middle schools bring diverse perspectives, and Mayfield nurtures their intellectual, spiritual, artistic, emotional, and physical gifts to prepare them for meaningful contributions to society.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMS OF NOTE

Formation of Self Seminar: A dynamic, research-informed program grounded in the power of girls' education, and guided by Holy Child Goals. Crafted to provide the tools for Mayfield students to thrive in high school, four years of FOS empowers adolescent girls to grow into the best version of themselves in order to become positive contributors to their community, and impactful agents of change in the world.

Math Modeling: Students transform classroom knowledge into powerful tools for real-world problem-solving. By creating mathematical representations of complex scenarios, our students develop exceptional problem-solving skills, creativity, and innovation. In math modeling competitions, they dive into pressing, real-life issues, researching, quantifying parameters, organizing data, and making impactful predictions.

Robotics: In partnership with the Girl Scouts of Greater Los Angeles, Mayfield hosts two award-winning FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) robotics teams that design, build, and test their projects in a dedicated 856-square-foot campus space. The Rock N' Roll Robots, founded in 2007 as the first GSGLA-sponsored FTC team, and the Javabots, established in 2015, provide more girls the opportunity to engage in robotics. Students build and program advanced robots while also developing skills in community service, public speaking, and writing. Both teams are recognized as model FTC programs.

Senior Service Program: During senior year, Mayfield students volunteer with three community organizations in the first semester, gaining perspective on service and social impact. In the second semester, they select one of those organizations for Senior Service Week in May. With at least 50 hours of service, along with reflection and discussion, seniors deepen their understanding of civic responsibility and the transformative power of service.
