School Goals

- Increase the percentage of students scoring developing or above on all Milestone courses.
- Increase the percentage of students who are present 90% of their enrolled time from a baseline of 46% in FY 25 to 51% in FY 26.

Focus Areas

- Use literacy strategies to support Reading mastery on standardized assessments and across content areas using the methods of QARR (Question Answer Response Relationship) and Close Read (read the text carefully, identify themes and analyze connections).
- Track attendance goals, schedule data talks, and earn PBIS incentives and recognition.

To help your child meet the district and school goals, the school, the family, and the child have specific responsibilities to fulfill. These responsibilities are outlined below.

Westside High School Administrators and Teachers will:

- Keep students and families informed about the 21st Century After School Tutoring Program, a suite of safety nets that serve to provide students with remediation or acceleration in courses and subject-area content.
- Provide students with a class syllabus for each course detailing course materials, expectations, and grading procedures. Teachers will maintain websites that include linked resources to support parents and students with increasing student achievement.
- Offer Grade Level Parent Meetings that focus on math and literacy standards, student engagement opportunities, and available resources to support student achievement. Family engagement events will provide information about graduation requirements, SAT/ACT preparation, dual enrollment, and test-taking strategies for End of Course exams.

- Offer continuous and current feedback regarding student progress through Parent Portal, the online grade, attendance, and behavior report. Parents are encouraged to use Parent Portal for online access to their child's progress and updates.
- Provide information to parents and family members through the Westside High School website; teacher webpages; flyers; ParentSquare text messaging app; Canvas, the school's learning management platform; school marquee; e-bulletins; Westside Facebook, X, and YouTube.
- Hold student-led conferences throughout the year. Parents are welcome to request a teacher conference with one or more teachers, counselors, and/or administrators. Parents can request these meetings by contacting staff directly via email or phone. This compact will be discussed at the annual Title I parent meeting, and during parent teacher conferences or events held throughout the year to emphasize the shared responsibility for student success.
- Provide progress reports every 6 weeks and report cards at the end of each semester via Parent Portal. Teachers may also contact parents as needed to provide updates on student progress.
- Develop opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities. Westside High School welcomes and encourages parents and family members to volunteer and participate in school activities/events. Volunteer training and a background check are required. Please contact the front office for more information.

Parent Responsibilities: As a parent, I will do the following to help my child meet the overall district and school goals:

- Encourage my child to participate in any improvement opportunities, including afterschool tutoring and other resources.
- Check the school's website regularly and request updates concerning resources to assist my child with graduation plans and career and college readiness development.
- Participate in family Grade Level Parent Meetings and other events to understand the curriculum and resources available to support academic achievement as well as clubs and extra curriculum activities.
- Attend parent and/or student-led conferences in person or via Teams.
- Monitor my child's progress by having conversations with him/her and by regularly checking his/her progress in Parent Portal.
- Promote the use of available web resources USA Testprep to improve my child's performance on State assessments.
- Encourage my child to read independently and ensure access to reading material at home.

Student Responsibilities: As a student, I will do the following to help meet the overall district and school goals:

- Participate in tutoring sessions when needed.
- Use web resources provided by teachers, listen to school announcements, and communicate information to my parents.
- Attend at least one workshop or Grade Level Parent Meetings with my family to learn more about available school resources to support the 4ME's: Enrolled, Enlisted, Employed, Entrepreneurship.
- Communicate with my parents, teachers, counselor, and administrators about my progress and become a self-directed learner.
- Set goals and know data for student-led conferences.
- Join a club or extra curriculum activity.
- Attend meetings on graduation requirements and participate in advisement sessions about career and college-readiness preparation.
- Read more and look for ways to enjoy a variety of reading materials (magazines, fiction, and nonfiction books, etc.).
