

## Message from Blair Community Schools Superintendent, Dr. Randy Gilson




Dear Blair Community,

As we begin October, I want to share some exciting updates on our district's budget, safety priorities, and the many great things happening in our schools. At the recent Board of Education meeting, the budget process was completed with an important outcome for our community. Our total levy has once again been lowered to 75 cents. Over the past eight years, Blair has steadily reduced its levy, demonstrating both financial responsibility and the strong support of our taxpayers. Today, our levy ranks among the lowest in the greater metro area and across the state for a district of our size. This reflects our ability to operate efficiently while continuing to deliver excellent opportunities for our students.



We are also appreciative that the Board approved an increase in spending authority of 1.5%, which provides an additional \$435,675 for the year. This action gives us the flexibility to address needs, plan for the future, and continue providing the high-quality education our community expects. Thanks to years of careful planning, we have also built up both our cash reserve and our special building fund. These resources give us confidence that we have multiple options to address important facility needs in the months ahead.

One of our ongoing priorities is student and staff safety. While additional funds for major facility changes were not included in this year's budget, our focus remains strong on replacing and upgrading classroom door locks at Arbor Park and Deerfield Elementary. We are also exploring relocating the main offices at Arbor Park Elementary, Otte Middle School, and the South Early Childhood Center to areas closer to the entrances in order to provide more secure access points for our schools. With the reserves we have built and the spending authority increase, we are confident that we will find ways to move forward on these projects.

Beyond finances, the year is off to an outstanding start. Our recent Homecoming Week was a tremendous success, bringing together students, families, alumni, and community members to celebrate Blair traditions and school spirit. The parade, pep rally, and football game all showcased the pride we share in our schools. Looking ahead, parent-teacher conferences are quickly approaching. These conferences are one of the most valuable opportunities for families and teachers to connect, review student progress, and set goals for success. I encourage all parents to take part in this important partnership.

Thank you for your continued support of Blair Community Schools. Together, we are ensuring that our students have access to outstanding educational opportunities in an environment that is both safe and supportive.

#### Parent-Teacher Conferences – Mark Your Calendar!

We are excited to announce that Parent-Teacher Conferences will be held on Tuesday, October 15th, and Wednesday, October 16th, from 2:30 to 6:30 PM. These conferences provide a valuable opportunity for families to connect with teachers, discuss student progress, celebrate successes, and address any questions or concerns you may have about your child's learning.
