What is Title I?

Woodland Middle School is identified as a Title I school as part of the Elementary and Secondary Education Act of 1965 (ESEA). Title I Parent Family Engagement Plan is designed to support state and local school reform efforts tied to challenging state academic standards to reinforce and enhance efforts to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support parent and family engagement. All Title I schools must jointly develop a family engagement plan in writing and provide it to every participating family.

What is it?

This is a plan that describes how Woodland Middle School will provide opportunities to improve parent engagement to support student learning. Woodland Middle School values the contributions and involvement of parents to establish an equal partnership for the common goal of improving student achievement. This plan describes the different ways that Woodland Middle School will support parent and family engagement and how parents can help plan and participate in activities and events to promote student learning at school and home.

Who is it for?

All students participating in Title I, Part A program, and their families, are encouraged and invited to be full participants in the opportunities described in this plan. Woodland Middle School will provide opportunities for the participation of parents with limited English, parents with disabilities, and parents of migratory children.

How is it revised?

Woodland Middle School invited all parents to attend our Title I Parent Input meeting on September 4, 2025, to review and revise this parent and family engagement plan, as well as the schoolwide plan, our school-family compact, and the family engagement budget. Additionally, parent input and comments regarding this plan are welcome during the school year. The plan is posted on our school website for parents to view and submit feedback throughout the year. All parents' feedback received during the year will be used to revise the plan for the next school year. The feedback form asks for suggestions on the plan and the use of the 1% of the family engagement funds. Parents can also give feedback during several parent meetings and activities throughout the school year.

Where is it available?

For the 2025-2026 school year, we have made this plan easily accessible to parents and the community on the Woodland Middle School website in the fall of each year before November 01. Teachers and staff of Woodland Middle School can also provide and review an attached copy via email of this family plan with you during any parent-teacher conference. Any family or community member can also obtain a hard copy of this plan from the Woodland Middle School main office during school hours.

Communication

Woodland Middle School will take the following actions to provide parents of participating children the following:

ANNUAL TITLE I MEETING

Woodland Middle School will take the following actions to conduct an annual meeting, at a convenient time, and encourage and invite all parents of participating children to attend to inform them about the school’s Title I program, the nature of the Title I program, the parents’ requirements, the school parent and family engagement policy, the schoolwide plan, and the school-parent compact. The Annual Title I Meeting will be held on September 24, 2025 at 5:30PM. Should you be unable to attend, this meeting presentation will be available on October 2, 2025, on the school’s website.

School-Family Compact

- ❑ Parents, students, and teachers/staff work together to develop the School-Family Compact jointly.
- ❑ All parties agree to share responsibility for improved academic and student success. Parents, teachers/staff, and students partner together to achieve the State’s high standards. To build an equal partnership, stakeholders will review and revise our School-Family Compact in Fall 2025 at the Title I Stakeholder Input Meeting and through school-wide surveys. Feedback is welcome throughout the year.
- ❑ The Woodland Middle School-Family Compact for the 2025-2026 school year will be distributed in multiple ways: on the school website before October 31, 2025, emailed directly to parents via Blackboard Messenger, available to review during parent conferences or during live parent meetings online.

Reservation of Funds

- ❑ Parents share in decision-making regarding how Title I funds are allocated. Title I budget stipulates parents and families will determine how a “set-aside of 1%” of the funds will be spent on family engagement resources and activities.
- ❑ Budget input for the 2025-2026 school year was collected in Spring 2025. Per feedback, Title I funds will be used to impact all students by providing additional teachers/paraprofessionals to reduce class size, and on extra academic support to include professional development and instructional coaches.

Coordination of Services

- ❑ Woodland Middle School coordinates family engagement programs, activities, and strategies to help parents participate in their child’s education by reaching out to our feeder schools to invite families to attend the Parent Transitional meeting from 5th to 6th grade and 8th to 9th grade. We also strongly encourage families and students to attend fun family events such as school games and programs.

Building Capacity of Parents

- ❑ The school’s curriculum is provided to parents at our *Annual Title I Parent Meeting (see the presentation on the school’s website), Curriculum Night, Parent Resource Center workshops, and Student-Led Conferences*.
- ❑ Parents may gain more information about their child’s academic assessment results and interpretation of those results during student-led conferences. Questions regarding your child’s results may be directed to your child’s teacher or any member of the administrative team.
- ❑ Woodland Middle School uses assessments *GA Milestones End of Grade (EOG) and End Of Course Test (EOCT), iReady (Math and Reading)* to measure student progress and achievement levels of the challenging State’s academic standards.
- ❑ Parents can learn more about *The Georgia Standards of Excellence, Georgia Milestones, Fastbridge Testing, End of Course Test (EOCT), Title I, Part A (ESSA) requirements*, via the *Title I Annual Parent Meeting, Curriculum Night, Parent Resource Center workshops, Student-Led Conferences, and School Governance Council (SGC) meetings*. Information is available on our website, and testing dates are shared via the school newsletter.
- ❑ Parents can support their child’s academic progress by partnering with their child’s teachers by using *Infinite Campus* and supporting their child’s use of *Infinite Campus*. The login and password for Infinite Campus may be located at

Instructions will be posted to the website or provided at Virtual Parent Resource Center workshops, and the Parent Liaison will offer training and materials to help parents to work with their child at home. Additional materials and training to help parents to work with their child to improve literacy, math, and technology (i.e. Copyright/Piracy, Office365, Teams, Digital Citizenship, and Safety). Parents and families will be provided an invitation to all events with 2 weeks' notice to attend.

Building Capacity of School Staff and Capacity for Involvement

- ❑ Woodland Middle School values the utility of contributions of parents. We will educate school personnel on how to work effectively through Building *Staff Capacity Training* during the first and second semesters, and on-going secondary methods (i.e. email and social media) throughout the school year. Training will be based on the help and input shared from parents and families.
- ❑ The school is committed to working with parents to build ties between school and home by fostering 2-Way communication through evaluations/surveys, social media, email, comments, and feedback.
- ❑ Woodland Middle School will seek ways to incorporate the value and utility of our parents into our teachers' *Grade Level Meetings* one or more times per the school year. Parents are invited to share ways in which teachers can best communicate with parents to strengthen student achievement.
- ❑ Woodland Middle School is open to hearing from our families, and we invite you to be part of our *dynamic Wolverine PTA*.
