- Algebra Content: Create equations that describe linear and exponential relationships between quantities and explore the resulting equation.
- Milestones preparation- About two thirds of the way through the course, the Milestones practice test for algebra will be given in class. The results will be sent home to facilitate a cooperative remediation plan for each student.

- Encourage parents to enroll their child(ren) in Khan Academy and create a plan to develop and raise their test scores in Algebra.
- Keep parents informed about child(ren) education by communicating with the school through e-mail, parent-teacher conferences, comment cards, and phone calls.
- Provide input opportunities for parents to participate as appropriate in decisions relating to their child's education.
- Train and connect families to Core Six Literacy and Writing Strategies.
- Provide information about Georgia Virtual Learning through [GAVirtualLearning.org](http://GAVirtualLearning.org).
- Provide Learning Tracking /Reflection sheets and information throughout the year.
- Provide Milestones practice test results.
- Keep parents informed about decisions relating to their child's education.

- Record the amount of time I read daily or weekly.
- Be a confident student who values themselves as learners.
- Complete class assignments every day and ask for help when needed.
