

## **Community Relations**

### **Concept, Goals and Roles in Community Relations**

The Woodstock Board of Trustees recognizes that the community, defined broadly as the State and the surrounding community towns which have designated The Woodstock Academy as their secondary school, assists the Trustees in determining the quality of education at The Academy. It is imperative that members of the community and The Academy personnel cooperate in planning, developing policy, implementing programs and evaluating results with the Board of Trustees.

The Academy-community relations are not merely reporting and interpreting. Rather, they are part of an enterprise in which community members and The Academy personnel play their respective roles in the best interests of The Woodstock Academy.

The Board of Trustees establishes the following goals for the community relations program:

- To increase community understanding of the education afforded by The Academy to the communities which designate The Woodstock Academy as their secondary school;
- To increase community confidence and interest in The Academy;
- To promote effective dissemination of information concerning Academy activities;
- To solicit community opinions about The Academy; and
- To encourage the sharing of resources among civic and community organizations, where appropriate, for the benefit of The Academy.
