Representative and Deliberative Groups

The Board of Trustees encourages the Head of School or his/her designee to create and maintain appropriate groups such as councils, cabinets, and committees to foster good communication with the staff, faculty, students and public.

All committees created by the Head of School shall be for the purpose of obtaining, to a maximum degree, the advice and counsel of personnel of The Academy and to aid in district communication. Functioning in an advisory capacity, such groups may make recommendations for submission to the Board of Trustees through the Head of School. However, such groups shall exercise no inherent authority. Authority for establishing policy remains with the Board and authority for implementing policy remains with the Head of School. The membership, composition, and responsibilities of committees shall be defined by the Head of School and may be changed at his/her discretion.

Unless established permanently by the Board or the administration, these groups, committees, councils, cabinets, etc., shall serve in an ad hoc capacity. The charge and responsibility of such groups shall be defined at the time of appointment or organization.

Any recommendation of these groups shall be reviewed by the administration with any final report being presented to the Board or Board committee as determined by the Head of School.
