FAFSA Completion Requirement

The Board of Trustees recognizes that college, for many students, continues to be an important pathway that helps to provide students with the necessary skills for work and for lifelong learning. In addition, research has indicated the students who complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) are more likely to attend college with financial aid.

Beginning with classes graduating in 2027, graduating students, except those students who have a student visa, must have completed a Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

A principal, school counselor, teacher, or other certified educator may complete the waiver on behalf of any student if the certified educator affirms that they have made a good faith effort to contact the parent/legal guardian or student about the completion of the application.
