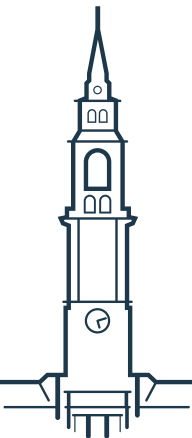

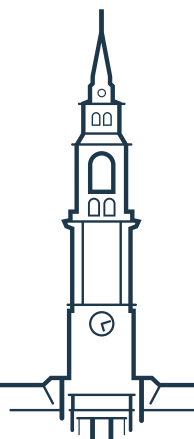


Carols by Candlelight

A welcome from our Admissions Tutor



At RHS, we keep the admissions process as friendly and straightforward as possible, so every pupil feels relaxed and ready to shine.

Each applicant will have a short, informal interview with me – simply a friendly conversation about their interests, hobbies, and what they enjoy at school. No preparation is needed, though pupils are welcome to bring something along to share if they wish – pupils sometimes choose a book, photo or certificate.

Where possible, we can combine the interview with a tour of the school or meetings with other staff, and for families further afield, interviews can take place online.

Pupils will also take part in our Entrance Assessment Day in January. This is designed to help us understand their academic strengths and support needs in an encouraging environment. For families with busy schedules, we can arrange alternative dates. Our Admissions Team will contact schools directly to obtain required reports and references.

Meeting new pupils is one of the joys of my role, and I'm very much looking forward to welcoming our 2026 entrants to RHS.

ASSESSMENT DAY

Pupils sit three papers as follows:

1. Verbal Reasoning (45 minutes)
2. Mathematics (45 minutes)
3. English (60 minutes)

Mathematics and English assessments are internally set and marked, tailored to the year of entry. Verbal Reasoning is assessed using GL Assessment papers.

Whilst some pupils may already be familiar with the style and structure of VR papers, for others it may be their first experience. To help pupils feel confident, there are a range of free practice and familiarisation resources available online.



RESULTS AND ACADEMIC SCHOLARSHIPS

It normally takes 2-3 weeks to notify parents whether their child has been offered a place at RHS. However, we generally do not provide feedback on individual test results.

The RHS Scholarship Programme recognises high-achieving and talented pupils who excel in specific areas. Academic Scholarships may be awarded following the Entrance Assessment Day, or pupils might be invited to an additional evaluation session after the initial assessments.

A welcome from the Head of Sixth Form



Choosing the right Sixth Form is a pivotal step in preparing for life beyond school - whether a pupils' next destination is university, an apprenticeship, or a specialist career path. At RHS, we are committed to equipping pupils with the skills, confidence, and knowledge they need to succeed. Our broad range of A Level and BTEC options is complemented by our distinctive RHSXtra programme, which adds depth, breadth, and inspiration to Sixth Form life.

Admissions decisions are based on a friendly interview with myself or the Deputy Head of Sixth Form, alongside predicted GCSE grades and a reference from the pupil's current school. We aim to offer places to pupils who will thrive both academically and personally in our diverse and dynamic Sixth Form community.

Typically, candidates are expected to achieve at least 33 points (an average of 5.5) across their six best GCSE subjects, including a minimum grade 4 in English Language and Mathematics. Subject-specific requirements vary, but as a guide, a grade 6 is expected for most A Level courses - or a grade 7 for Maths and Sciences. Where students do not meet the criteria, we will review applications on an individual basis.

Our process is designed to be holistic and supportive. We want every pupil to feel confident in the transition to Sixth Form, knowing they'll be guided and encouraged to realise their full potential.

Each year, we are proud to welcome new pupils from across the UK and around the world into our welcoming and aspirational community. I look forward to getting to know you and helping you take your next steps with purpose and excitement.

GCSE RESULTS DAY

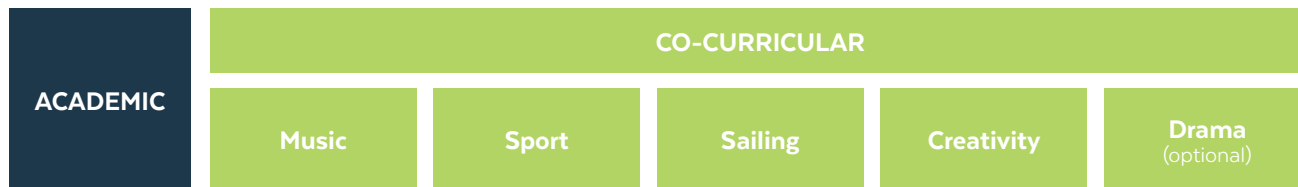

Pupils at all years of entry are warmly encouraged to apply, with internal scholarship reviews taking place at the start of Year 9 and Year 12.

Each award is thoughtfully considered, and becoming an RHS Scholar is something to be proud of - a celebration of achievement and the start of an exciting journey of growth and opportunity.

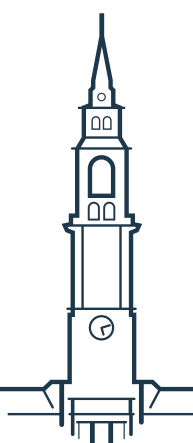
Every scholarship comes with dedicated support tailored to each discipline, including:

RHS Scholars are passionate and motivated pupils who demonstrate outstanding ability and a strong work ethic. All Scholars are expected to:

DEVELOPING TALENT ACROSS EVERY DISCIPLINE

To complement the core expectations and benefits shared by all Scholars, each discipline brings its own distinctive expectations and enrichment opportunities - specialist offerings that provide outstanding support and opportunity.

ACADEMIC

- Academic target setting, guidance and review
- Membership of, and attendance at, all Riddle Society subject talks (Years 7-9) and a minimum of five Studd Society sessions (Years 10-13) annually
- Completion of at least two summer projects per year
- Act as a role model and promote intellectual curiosity across all subjects
- Participation in cross-curricular and subject-specific competitions and (in-school, national and international)
- Participation in academic co-curricular activities such as debating and STEM
- Invitation to the annual Scholars' Dinner with an inspirational guest speaker

- Attend representative weekend competitions at least five times per year

- Compete on the national circuit of a British Youth Sailing Recognised Class at a minimum of three events per year
- Attend after-school theory, fitness, and coaching sessions
- Access to high-level coaching, equipment, storage, and strength and conditioning support
- Participation in Talented Performance Group with personalised mentoring and nutrition advice
- Coordination with external coaches to complement the RHS sailing programme and ensure the best support of the Scholar's development
- Support the promotion of sailing at RHS

SPORT

- Consistent high performance and attendance in A/1st teams
- Attendance at all training sessions and fixtures
- Support development of sport in the lower school and support coaching and guidance of younger pupils (where applicable)
- Enrolment encouraged in the Sixth Form Sports Leaders Programme (where applicable)
- Membership of Talented Performance Group with bespoke athletic development training
- Specific skills training in chosen sport(s) - including one-to-one and small group sessions throughout the year
- Mentoring including in goal setting and action planning, and in wellbeing and balancing commitments
- Coordination on elite performance with clubs, county and representative squads

CREATIVITY

(Art and Design & Technology)

- Maintain a personal portfolio, recording creative progress inside and outside the classroom
- Individualised target setting and half termly review with Head of Department
- Attend at least one Art/DT/STEM club per week
- Participate in summer projects, competitions, and at least one departmental trip annually
- Choose Art or DT at GCSE and A Level with required minimum grades (where applicable)
- Participation in STEM events, both in-school and nationally
- Opportunities for work to be exhibited within and outside of school
- Visiting artist talks and masterclasses
- Funded enrichment trip once a year (Design Museum, V&A Museum, universities)

DRAMA (Years 7 - 10)

- Active participation in all school productions, rehearsals, and lessons, performing in at least one school production per year
- Commitment to LAMDA graded exams (achieving merit or above), with subsidised LAMDA lessons (in exceptional cases)
- Selection of Drama as a subject at GCSE and Theatre Studies as an Elective in Sixth Form (where applicable)
- Completion of at least one summer Drama project each year
- Invitation to annual theatre workshops, and theatre trips/visits
- Support and guidance in preparing for auditions and applications to Drama courses and conservatoires post RHS.
- Termly progress review with Head of Department

RHS BURSARIES

Candidates in receipt of a Scholarship are eligible to apply for additional assistance by way of a means-tested RHS should the financial circumstances of the family necessitate it. Bursaries may be awarded in the form of remission on school fees, depending on the financial circumstances of the applicants and subject to the School's budgetary constraints but the combined amount of remission (Scholarship + Bursary) would not normally constitute more than 50% of the full fee.

DE NEUMANN SCHOLARSHIP - SEPTEMBER 2026 (Year 12)

Professor Bernard de Neumann (1943-2018) was a former pupil who provided a gift from his estate to support the continued development of mathematics. Thanks to this gift, we can support gifted young mathematicians by offering a means-tested scholarship of up to 100% every two years to a child from either Essex or Suffolk who is seeking to study Mathematics and/or Further Mathematics at A Level.

Pupils can apply at the point of registration, and should have a strong interest in mathematics, currently attend a state school in Essex or Suffolk and have high predicted grade in GCSE Mathematics and a strong reference. Desirable criteria include having competed in UKMT Mathematical Challenges and/or a pupil considering a career in mathematics or engineering.

APPLICATION PROCESS

All scholarships may be applied for at the point of registration at RHS. Academic Scholarships for Years 7-10 will be shortlisted following the Entrance Assessment Day, whilst Year 12 candidates will be invited to the Sixth Form Academic Scholarship Assessment Day.

Co-curricular Scholarships can be applied for using the Award Application Form and will be assessed during the week commencing 19 January 2026.

Pupils may apply for more than one award, and joint awards are occasionally made. However, these are limited to a maximum of two awards per pupil, and some disciplines cannot be held simultaneously due to the demands on time and commitment.

SERVICE FAMILIES

Founded in 1712 in Greenwich to educate the children of naval seafarers, RHS moved to its stunning 200-acre campus in Suffolk in 1933. Since then, the school has grown in both size and reputation to become one of East Anglia's leading independent schools.

While our values are rooted in our naval heritage, RHS is a modern and inclusive school that welcomes families from all backgrounds. We have a long-standing connection with the Armed Forces and a thriving boarding provision. We take pride in our understanding of the unique needs of service families, offering tailored support to ensure every pupil feels settled, supported, and ready to thrive.

MOD CONTINUITY OF EDUCATION ALLOWANCE (CEA)

Families in receipt of the MOD's Continuity of Education Allowance (CEA) benefit from a significantly reduced full boarding fee at RHS, making an RHS education both accessible and excellent value.

In line with MOD policy, CEA parents contribute the minimum requirement of 10% of school fees. The remainder is covered through a combination of MOD funding and RHS fee remission, resulting in a highly competitive offer, with a modest parental contribution.

Our approach is rooted in understanding, flexibility, and a long-standing commitment to Armed Forces families. With extensive experience in supporting pupils from service backgrounds, we provide stability, care and opportunity - giving families confidence that their child's education is in capable and compassionate hands.

SUPPORT FOR NAVAL SEAFARERS

RHS is part of Greenwich Hospital, a Crown body, one of whose charitable objectives is to provide for the education of the children of seafarers. The school is proud of its historic links with the Royal Navy, Royal Marines and Royal Fleet Auxiliary. This is why we are able to offer discounts and generous bursaries to 1st generation seafaring families, enabling their child or children to benefit from an outstanding education at one of the country's leading co-educational boarding schools.

Greenwich Hospital provide two funding support options:

1. Greenwich Hospital Discount

GH Discounts provide a non means-tested fee remission of 15%

2. Greenwich Hospital Bursary

GH Bursaries are means-tested awards, offering fee remission of up to 50%.

Bursaries are allocated based on:

- Educational and pastoral need
- Seafaring priority, with the children of serving personnel taking priority over retired personnel
- Entrance examination and interview performance
- Availability of places (day or boarding) within each year group

RHS SIBLING DISCOUNT

Families with two children in the School at the same time receive a 5% discount on the Boarding or Day fee for the eldest child. Those with three children in the school are eligible for 10% discount for the eldest and 5% discount on the second eldest and those with four children will receive 15% discount on the eldest, 10% on the second eldest and 5% on the third eldest, when all are at school at the same time. The sibling discount does not apply to fees discounted by a means-tested bursary, Continuity of Education Allowance and certain other discounts.

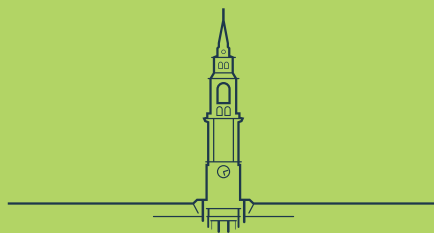
