#### **AMITY COMMUNITY**

Spanning 58 square miles and located 75 miles east of New York City, Amity Regional School District #5 serves the educational needs of Bethany, Orange, and Woodbridge, Connecticut for grades 7-12.

The district consists of one high school, grades 9-12, and two middle schools, grades 7-8. The district is contiguous to New Haven, a major center of higher education, medicine, and the arts. Home to many professionals, the median household income range from \$102k-\$133k by town. The vast majority of family dwellings are single-family owner-owned homes.



- Opened in 1954 and rebuilt in the early 1990s

#### **SPECIAL PROGRAMS**

- Science Research: A four-year honors, application only, program taken in conjunction with a regular science course load.
- Educational Center for The Arts: An off-campus program in New Haven offering courses in dance, instrumental and vocal music, poetry and prose, theater and visual arts. Admission is competitive. Students earn three courses worth of honors credit annually toward graduation.
- Dual Enrollment: An opportunity for students to take courses while still in high school. Credit is awarded at both the high school and college level. Partnerships with UCONN ECE, University of Bridgeport, and Sacred Heart University.
- Concurrent Enrollment: An opportunity for students to take a college course on a college campus after school hours. Partnerships with Yale, Southern, and Gateway Community College.

- Independent Study: Juniors, and seniors may apply.
   After approval, students conduct an in-depth study in an area of interest. Honors credit is awarded.
- International Studies Program: Amity students come together with students from surrounding schools to study a specific international topic.
- Unpaid Experiential Learning Program: Seniors are placed in work experience where they receive on-the-job training and field experience in a chosen career field in the final weeks of senior year.

**L1** – Level one provides a comprehensive, challenging curriculum and includes preparation for some AP exams.

**L2** – Level two provides courses that offer a challenging and comprehensive curriculum requiring above average academic ability.

**L3** — Level three provides a basic foundation for academic work for post-secondary schools and colleges.



## DISTRIBUTION OF GRADE POINT AVERAGES (N=299)


