Old Business -

- 1) SHAC goals for the 2025-26 school year
 - a) Community activities (bootcamps, dance lessons, etc) being provided to staff once a month - special rates/discounts
 - b) Self-defense / self-protection lessons / training for employees / families? (Debbie Nash will research and bring back info)
 - c) Campus teams - check-ins with a buddy / coffee talks for staff / mental-health check-in for staff (Kayla Walling can bring more info back)
- 2) Employee Assistance Program (EAP) research for possible inclusion in 2026-2027 school year
 - a) 9/2/25 WAC visited with PsychPlus who will create a proposal
 - i) Online provider - can offer so many sessions in person or online
 - ii) Virtual therapy

District Updates:

- A) Health Services
 - a) Jumped into November numbers EARLY because of the size of campuses;
 - b) Balancing new consents and new way of approaching
 - i) Fluid and moving pieces and layers
- B) Nutrition Services

- a) New after school feeding program - currently at 9 campuses
 - i) All secondary campuses & 4 elem that have B&G clubs
 - ii) Qualifying program - tutoring
 - (1) Can be extended to any student that are staying
 - (2) Free to all students, 18 & under
 - (3) Meal pattern is compliant for "supper" - all the food group components
 - (4) Grab and go but have to eat it on campus
 - (5) Could expand and can focus on heavy tutoring days
- b) F/R Applications: still have 701 students that will lose benefits if parents do not complete applications - anyone can apply for F/R at any time - those that lose status will have to pay the charges that accrue
- C) Counseling Services
 - a) Postsecondary planning at HS
 - b) Elementary - a lot of big feelings - transitioning covid babies to Kindergarten
