#### COMPLETING THE IMPACT AID SURVEY

#### COMPLETE THE **DESKTOP VERSION** OF THE IMPACT AID SURVEY

- 1. Login to Skyward Family Access at Q.skschools.org.
  - · If you need help with your Login ID or password, contact your student's school office.
- 2. On your home screen, select the Impact Aid Program Survey tile.
- 3. Click Start at the top of the screen to begin the survey.
- Complete all required areas of the survey (marked with a red asterisk \*).
- 5. When finished, click Complete & Review at the top of the screen.
- Review your answers and make any necessary changes. Once you've verified the information is correct, check
  the box at the bottom of the screen that says: "I confirm that all of the above information is correct to the best
  of my ability."
- 7. Click Submit Form at the top of the screen.

#### COMPLETE THE IMPACT AID SURVEY IN THE SKYWARD APP

- 1. Open the Skyward Family Access App.
  - Make sure your Skyward Family Access app is up to date. Update instructions can be found in the Resource Guide library via the Qmlativ link at the top of the SKSD home page (<u>www.skschools.org</u>).
- 2. Login with your Skyward Family Access Login ID and password.
  - If you don't know or have forgotten your Login ID or password, please contact your student's school's main
    office.
- On the home screen, tap the Impact Aid Program Survey tile.
- 4. Tap Start at the top of the screen to begin the survey.
- Complete all required areas of the survey (marked with a red asterisk \*).
- 6. When finished, tap Complete at the top of the screen.
- Review your answers and make any necessary changes. Once you've verified the information is correct, check the box at the bottom of the screen that says: "I confirm that all of the above information is correct to the best of my ability."
- 8. Tap Submit Form at the top of the screen.

#### MWMS Launches School-Wide Think Tanks to Support Students and Community

This fall, Marcus Whitman Middle School launched several school-wide Think Tanks, where teachers have volunteered their time to strengthen systems that support student learning, behavior, and engagement. These teams are part of our Multi-Tiered System of Supports (MTSS), a framework that uses data to improve student achievement and well-being through early intervention, research-based practices, and consistent monitoring.

MTSS A & B Teams

- MTSS A focuses on academic systems, coordinating interventions for students who need additional support and designing enrichment opportunities for advanced learners. The team also develops protocols for staff professional development and data-driven instructional planning.
- MTSS B focuses on behavior, creating a schoolwide Positive Behavior and Intervention Support (PBIS) framework, monitoring behavior data, and developing recognition and support systems that promote a positive school culture and sense of belonging.

#### Other Think Tanks

- Family & Community Engagement strengthens partnerships with families and the broader community through communication, events, and feedback to support student success.
- **Marketing & Rebranding** works to highlight academic growth, promote positive school culture, and strengthen community trust through a unified brand identity and visible celebrations of student and staff achievements.
- Attendance develops proactive strategies to encourage consistent, on-time attendance and ensure all students feel connected and expected at school.

Through these volunteer-led teams, MWMS is creating stronger systems, fostering equity, and building a culture where every student feels seen, supported, and valued. Parents, guardians, and students may also be invited to participate in Think Tank design to provide input and strengthen our community partnerships.

#### Fall STAR Reading & Math Results

Our students take the **STAR Reading and Math benchmark assessments** three times each year—in the fall, winter, and spring. These assessments provide valuable information about where students are starting, how they are growing, and what supports they may need to be successful.

#### This fall, we had strong participation rates:

6th Grade: 95% 7th Grade: 96% 8th Grade: 95%

High participation matters because it gives us a more complete picture of student learning across the school. It also highlights the importance of regular attendance—when students are present, they can engage in learning, show what they know, and benefit from the support we provide.

Here is the percentage of students who scored **at or above grade-level benchmark** this fall. This means they demonstrated the skills and knowledge expected for their grade level at this point in the year:

**6th Grade**: Reading 55%, Math 53% **7th Grade**: Reading 59%, Math 47% **8th Grade**: Reading 56%, Math 53%

For example, in 6th grade reading, 55% of students scored at or above the benchmark, showing they are on track for success in grade-level reading. The remaining students scored below the benchmark, which helps us identify who may need additional support to reach grade-level expectations.

These results give us a clear starting point for the year. We also know we have a lot of work to do—ultimately, we want **100% of students at or above benchmark**. Our focus will remain on supporting growth for every student and celebrating progress along the way.

If you have questions about your child's scores or want to learn more about their progress in **Skyward**, please reach out to their teacher. Teachers are happy to share insights about student learning, suggest ways to support at home, and answer any questions you may have.


