GRADING SYSTEM

- Viewpoint School does not rank.
- Viewpoint reports weighted and unweighted GPAs on a 4.0 scale for work completed at Viewpoint only.
- One point is added to the cumulative weighted GPA for each Honors, AP, and VAS course.
- VAS (Viewpoint Advanced Studies) refers to post-AP classes that represent the most advanced classes in those subjects.
- Limited AP and VAS course availability in Ninth and Tenth Grade.
- Application and department approval required for Honors, AP, and VAS classes.
- Minimum of five classes required per semester, with many students taking six or seven classes and exceeding graduation requirements.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Social Studies	3 1/2 years, including one semester designated Global Core
World Languages	3 years of the same language, with at least 2 years in the Upper School, or 2 years each of 2 different languages

Physical Education	8 trimesters (two seasons per year)

Community Service	45 hours (minimum) of volunteer work prior to graduation

Curriculum Highlights

Viewpoint School offers courses across the curriculum in core academic subjects—English, history, math, sciences, world languages—as well as robust offerings in the performing and visual arts, computer science, social and emotional learning, and independent studies. Some highlights include:

Human Development—Skills and Mentors Honors

Student-centered and process-based, this experiential training exposes students to communication strategies, personal goal setting, cultural competency, and group facilitation abilities to guide conversations toward meaningful exploration and conflict resolution. Students mentor Ninth Grade students as well as students in Middle School.

Robotics

Robotics are lab-based courses introducing the principles of robotics through the design, construction, and control of mobile robots. Students engage in research, calculations, and experiments to analyze robotic subsystems, applying concepts in motion control, sensor integration, and programming. Students will document and evaluate subsystem performance, problem solve and design optimization skills essential for advanced STEM study. Viewpoint hosts the Clash in the Canyons every October, with 35+ teams competing.

Film at Viewpoint

Film starts in Middle School with hands-on, project-based electives ranging from stop-motion animation to music video production, exploration of new media and screenwriting. In the Upper School, students choose from different tracks—Narrative and Experimental, Documentary, Acting and Directing for Film, and Sports Media. Or they can mix and match, and even design their own independent study projects. All pathways explore the aesthetic, technical and ideological choices that filmmakers make to convey their story. Students enter and often win in national film festivals.

Sports Media

Students learn multimedia journalism centered around Viewpoint sports to produce different media content. Sports Media is a semester elective that promotes community and school spirit by utilizing a variety of skill sets to create informational and promotional videos for sports teams. Students also have opportunities to hear from various professionals in the sports media industry.

SCHOLAR PROGRAMS & HONOR SOCIETIES

Midway through junior year, interested students apply for one of the Scholars Programs. Requirements include AP, elective coursework, and experiential learning opportunities. The creation of an online portfolio is completed by September of senior year. Incorporating feedback from faculty committees, students polish the portfolio and receive a Scholars Program designation on their transcript.

Global Scholars is for students who want to explore cultures and their values, artifacts, and issues. Requirements include advanced coursework in World Languages and Social Studies, experiential learning, and a portfolio of reflections on their cultural experiences.

Literary Scholars unites a community of readers and writers who engage in advanced English coursework, join formal writing communities on campus and beyond, and create a portfolio of work.

STEM Scholars challenges students to apply STEM skills in real-world contexts through advanced coursework in Science, Computer Science, and Mathematics. Experiential learning includes interviews with industry experts, research trips abroad, and internships with leading professionals.

Business Scholars is the newest program that will be available to students starting in the spring of 2026.
