Long Beach has been recognized as the most ethnically and culturally diverse municipality among the nation's 100 largest cities. Opened in 1895, and located in the inner city, the school enrolls 4,080 students in grades 9-12. Long Beach Poly is accredited by the Western Association Schools and Colleges. According to the California Department of Education 59.5% of our students are considered socioeconomically disadvantaged, 14.5% are English Language Learners, 0.4% are foster youth, and 11.8% of our students have identified disabilities.

**PACE** is a nationally recognized, highly rigorous program offering students one-of-a-kind experiences in fields including policy and government, environmental research, biomedical research, communication and cultural literacy

### Center for International Curriculum

**CIC** is a rigorous, honors college preparatory program offering students a wide range of honors and AP courses with a global emphasis. The program includes Japanese and/or Chinese languages and civic leadership experience.

### Meds

**Meds** is a college preparatory program preparing students for cutting edge medical careers, focused specifically on patient care (both mental and physical) and information technology. The program offers extensive university-approved Career and Technical Education courses and experience with state-of-the-art technology

### Pacific Rim

**PACRIM** is a California Partnership Academy offering smaller class sizes, college preparatory curriculum and unique career opportunities focused on international tourism, trade, and commerce.

### Poly Academy of Achievers

**PAAL** is a program designed for 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students with an emphasis on Human and Family services. PAAL provides students a smaller environment in which to strive and learn. These student take courses on a quarter system unlike the other programs which are on a semester system.

Since 2002, the Long Beach Unified School District does not rank students.


### GPA CALCULATION


GPA is computed using the above quality points. Beginning in Grade 9, all subjects, whether passed or failed are included in the computation.

Total GPA = 9th-12<sup>th</sup> all courses  
Academic GPA = 9th-12<sup>th</sup> academic courses only  
University GPA = Weighted GPA, grades 10-12

## GRADE DISTRIBUTION

20.1% earned a perfect unweighted 4.0 GPA

## SAT

In 24-25 school year, **220** students took the SAT with a total mean score of **1052**, reading/writing score of **541**, and a math mean score of **512**.
