Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BP) 9322 Agenda/Meeting Materials

Agenda Content

Governing Board meeting agendas shall reflect the district's vision and goals and the Board's focus on student outcomes and well-being.

Each agenda shall state the meeting time and location and shall briefly describe each item to be transacted or discussed, including items to be discussed in closed session. (Government Code 54954.2)

The Board aspires to:

- Invest no less than 50% of the total Board authorized public meeting minutes each month into effectively monitoring its goals.
- Only Board work is discussed and /or acted upon during Board-authorized public meetings.
- The Board schedules no more than three topics for discussion during any Board-authorized public meeting.

cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

The agenda shall provide members of the public the opportunity to address the Board on any agenda item before or during the Board's consideration of the item. The agenda does not need to provide an opportunity for public comment on an item that has previously been considered at an open meeting by a committee comprised exclusively of Board members, provided that members of the public were afforded an opportunity to comment on the item, before or during the committee's consideration of the item, and the item has not been substantially changed since the committee considered it. (Government Code 54954.3)

The agenda for a regular meeting shall also provide members of the public an opportunity to address the Board regarding matters within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board which are not on the agenda. (Education Code 35145.5; Government Code 54954.3)

The notice and agenda shall describe the means available for the public to access the meeting and provide public comment in-person and, if a Board member is appearing remotely due to an emergency circumstance or for just cause pursuant to Government Code 54953, through an internet-based service or call-in option. (Government Code 54953)

Each agenda for a regular meeting shall list the address designated by the Superintendent or designee for public inspection of documents related to an open session item, or for records of a statement threatening litigation against the district to be discussed in closed session, when such documents have been distributed to the Board less than 72 hours before meeting. (Government Code 54956.9, 54957.5)

The agenda shall include information regarding how, when, and to whom a request for disability-related accommodations or modifications, including auxiliary aids and services, may be made by an individual who requires accommodations or modifications in order to participate in the Board meeting, as well as the procedure for receiving and resolving such requests as required by law. (Government Code 54954.2, 54953)

Each agenda shall include a statement regarding the option for students and parents/guardians to request that directory information or personal information of the student or parent/guardian, as defined in Education Code 49061 and/or 49073.2, be excluded from the minutes. The agenda shall also state that the request must be made in writing to the secretary or clerk of the Board.

Agenda Preparation

The Board president and the Superintendent, as Secretary to the Board, shall work together to develop the agenda for each regular and special meeting.

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Any Board member or member of the public may request that a matter within the jurisdiction of the Board be placed on the agenda of a regular meeting. The request shall be submitted in writing to the Superintendent or designee with supporting documents and information.

The Board president and Superintendent shall decide whether a request from a member of the public is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board. Items not within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board may not be placed on the agenda. In addition, before placing an item on the agenda, the Board president and Superintendent shall determine if the item is merely a request for information, and if so, respond accordingly.

If the Board president and Superintendent deny a request from a Board member to place an item on the agenda, the Board member may request the Board take action during a Board meeting to determine whether the item shall be placed on the agenda. The Board President and Superintendent shall also decide whether an agenda item is appropriate for discussion in open or closed session, whether the item should be an action item subject to Board vote, or an information, item and when the item is placed on the agenda.

Any Board action that involves borrowing \$100,000 or more shall be discussed, considered and deliberated upon as a separate item of business on the meeting agenda (Government Code 53635.7)

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All public communications with the Board are subject to requirements of relevant Board policies and administrative regulations.

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In order to promote efficient meetings, the Board may bundle a number of items and act upon them together by a single vote through the use of a consent agenda. Consent items shall be items of a routine nature and items for which Board discussion is not anticipated and for which the Superintendent recommends approval.

When any Board, member requests the removal of an item from the consent agenda, the item shall be removed and given individual consideration for action as a separate agenda item.

The agenda shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to comment on any consent agenda

item unless such item has been previously considered at an open meeting of a committee comprised exclusively of Board members. (Government Code 54954.3)

Agenda Dissemination to Board Members

A week At least 72 hours before each regular meeting, each Board member shall have be provided access to an electronic version a copy of the agenda, and agenda packet, including the Superintendent or designee's report; minutes to be approved; copies of communications; reports from committees, staff, and others; and other available supporting documents pertinent to the meeting. Any necessary amendments to the agenda will be at least 72 hours before the regular meeting.

When special meetings are called, Board members shall receive, at least 24 hours prior to the meeting, notice of the business to be transacted. (Government Code 54956)

Board members shall review agenda materials before each meeting. Individual members may confer directly with the Superintendent or designee to ask questions and/or request additional information on agenda items. Members shall submit agenda item questions to the Superintendent's office for inclusion for the board meeting Q&A document, in accordance with the Board Agenda Preparation Calendar.

However, A a majority of Board members shall not, outside of a noticed meeting, directly or through intermediaries or electronic means discuss, deliberate, or take action on any matter within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board.

Agenda Dissemination to Members of the Public

Agenda and related materials distributed to the Board shall be made available to the public upon request without delay. However, only those documents which are disclosable public records under the Public Records Act (PRA) and which relate to an agenda item scheduled for the open session portion of a regular meeting shall be made available to the public. (Government Code 54956.9, 54957.5)

At least 72 hours prior to a regular meeting, the agenda shall be posted at one or more locations freely accessible to members of the public. (Government Code 54954.2)

In addition, the Superintendent or designee shall post the agenda on the homepage of the district website. The posted agenda shall be accessible through a prominent direct link to the current agenda or to the district's agenda management platform in accordance with Government Code 54954.2.

When the district utilizes an integrated agenda management platform, the link to that platform shall take the user directly to the website with the district's agendas, and the current agenda shall be the first available. (Government Code 54954.2)

If a writing which relates to an open session agenda item or which contains a claim or written threat of litigation which will be discussed in closed session during a regular Board meeting is distributed to the Board less than 72 hours prior to a meeting, the Superintendent or designee shall make the writing available for public inspection at a designated location at the same time the document is distributed to all or a majority of the Board. However, if the writing is distributed to at least a majority of the Board at a time when the designated location is closed to the public, this requirement may be satisfied by posting

the writing on the district website if the following conditions are met: (Government Code 54957.5)

- 1. An initial staff report or similar document containing an executive summary and any staff recommendations related to the agenda item is made available for public inspection at the designated location at least 72 hours before the meeting
- 2. The writing is immediately posted on the district's website in a position and manner that makes it clear that the writing relates to an agenda item for the upcoming meeting
- 3. The district lists the website address where such writings may be accessed on all Board meeting agendas
- 4. A physical copy of the document is made available for public inspection at the designated location at the beginning of the next regular business hours, but not less than 24 hours before the relevant Board meeting

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(cf. 1113 – District and School Web Sites)
(cf. 1340 – Access to District Records)
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The Superintendent or designee shall mail a copy of the agenda or a copy of all the documents constituting the agenda packet to any person who requests the items. The materials shall be mailed at the time the agenda is posted or upon distribution of the agenda to a majority of the Board, whichever occurs first.

The Superintendent or designee shall email a copy of, or a website link to, the agenda or a copy of all the documents constituting the agenda packet to any person who requests such items to be delivered by email. If the Superintendent or designee determines that it is technologically infeasible to do so, a copy of the agenda or a website link to the agenda and a copy of all other documents constituting the agenda packet shall be sent to the person who has made the request in accordance with mailing requirements specified in law. (Government Code 54954.1)

Any document prepared by the district or Board and distributed during a public meeting shall be made available for public inspection at the meeting. Any document prepared by another person shall be made available for public inspection after the meeting. These requirements shall not apply to a document that is exempt from public disclosure under the Public Records Act. (Government Code 54957.5)

Any request for mailed copies of agendas or agenda packets shall be in writing and shall be valid for the calendar year in which it is filed. Written requests must be renewed following January 1 of each year. (Government Code 54954.1)

Persons requesting mailing of the agenda or agenda packet shall pay an annual fee, as determined by the Superintendent or designee, not to exceed the cost of providing the service.

Upon request, the Superintendent or designee shall make the agenda, agenda packet, and/or any writings distributed at the meeting available in appropriate alternative formats to persons with a disability, as required by the Americans with Disabilities Act. (Government Code 54954.1)

Fresno Unified School District Board Bylaw (BB) 9323 Meeting Conduct

Meeting Procedures

All Governing Board meetings shall begin on time and shall be guided by an agenda prepared in accordance with Board bylaws and posted and distributed in accordance with the Ralph M. Brown Act (open meeting requirements) and other applicable laws.

(cf. 9322 - Agenda/Meeting Materials)

The Board president shall conduct Board meetings in accordance with Board bylaws and procedures that enable the Board to efficiently consider issues and carry out the will of the majority.

(cf. 9121 - President)

The Board aspires that:

- Only Board Work¹ is discussed and /or acted on during Board-authorized public meetings.
- There are no more than two Board-authorized public meetings per month and none lasts more than two hours.
- The Board schedules no more than three topics for discussion during any Board-authorized public meeting.

The Board believes that late night meetings deter public participation, can affect the Board's decision-making ability, and can be a burden to staff. Regular Board meetings shall be adjourned by at 10:30 p.m. Unless extended to a specific time determined by a majority of the Board. The meeting shall be extended no more than once and may be adjourned to a later date.

(cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)

Quorum and Abstentions

The Board shall act by majority vote of all of the membership constituting the Board. (Education Code 35164)

(cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)

The Board believes that when no conflict of interest requires abstention, its members have a duty to vote on issues before them. When a member abstains their abstention shall not be counted for purposes of determining whether a majority of the membership of the Board has taken action.

(cf. 9270 - Conflict of Interest)

Provided the Board typically has seven members and there are no more than two vacancies on the Board, the vacant position(s) shall not be counted for purposes of determining how many members of the Board constitute a majority. In addition, whenever any provisions of the Education Code require unanimous action of all or a specific number of the members, the vacant position(s) shall not be counted for purposes of determining the total membership constituting the Board. (Education Code 35165)

Public Participation

Members of the public are encouraged to attend Board meetings and to address the Board concerning any item on the agenda or within the Board's jurisdiction. So as not to inhibit public participation, persons

¹ Board work: Items that are discussed and /or acted on during Board-authorized public meetings because either state or federal law/rule requires the Board to do so or because the items directly pertain to the Board's adopted goals or guardrails. Items that are not legally required and that the Board has not designated as Board work through the Board's goals or guardrails are, by default, Superintendent work.

attending Board meetings shall not be requested to sign in, complete a questionnaire, or otherwise provide their name or other information as a condition of attending the meeting, except that if the meeting is conducted using remote public participation or with a Board member attending remotely pursuant to Government Code 54953, a member of the public desiring to provide comment through the use of a third party internet website or online platform may be required to register as required by the third party provider.

In order to conduct district business in an orderly and efficient manner, the Board requires that public presentations to the Board comply with the following procedures:

- 1. The Board shall give members of the public an opportunity to address the Board on any item of interest to the public that is within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, either before or during the Board's consideration of the item. (Education Code 35145.5, Government Code 54954.3)
- 2. At a time so designated on the agenda at a regular meeting, members of the public may bring before the Board matters that are not listed on the agenda. The Board shall take no action or discussion on any item not appearing on the posted agenda, except as authorized by law. (Education Code 35145.5; Government Code 54954.2)

Members of the public who wish to address the board shall submit a speaker card specifying the item they wish to address. The speaker card will require the name of the speaker and request they identify their address, school and if they are a student, parent, district resident or other community member. To the extent practical, the card should be submitted before the Board president announces the specific item.

Unscheduled oral communications shall be limited to a maximum of 30 minutes, but may be extended at the discretion of the Board president.

3. Without taking action, Board members or district staff members may briefly respond to statements made or questions posed by the public about items not appearing on the agenda. Additionally, on their own initiative or in response to questions posed by the public, a Board or staff members may ask a question for clarification, make a brief announcement, or make a brief report on their own activities. (Government Code 54954.2)

Furthermore, the Board or a Board Member may provide a reference to staff or other resources for factual information, ask staff to report back to the Board at a subsequent meeting concerning any matter, or take action directing staff to place a matter of business on a future agenda. (Government Code 54954.2)

4. The Board need not allow the public to speak on any item that has already been considered by a committee composed exclusively of Board members at a public meeting where the public had the opportunity to address the committee on that item. However, if the Board determines that the item has been substantially changed since the committee heard it; the Board shall provide an opportunity for the public to speak. (Government Code 54954.3)

(cf. 9130 - Board Committees)

5. A person wishing to be heard by the Board shall first be recognized by the president and shall then proceed to comment as briefly as the subject permits. Individual speakers will be allowed three minutes to address the Board on each agenda item, or nonagenda item. The president may, based on compelling circumstances, limit speakers' time to two (2) minutes (for example, when there is a large number of speakers that wish to be heard). A speaker may receive only one (1) deferral of another speaker's time. The Board shall limit the total time for public input for each agenda item to 20 minutes. With

Board consent, the Board president may increase or decrease the time allowed for public presentation, depending on the topic and the number of persons wishing to be heard. Any such adjustment shall be done equitably so as to allow a diversity of viewpoints. The president may take a poll of speakers for or against a particular issue and may ask that additional persons speak only if they have something new to add.

In order to ensure that non-English speakers receive the same opportunity to directly address the Board, any member of the public who utilizes a translator shall be provided at least twice the allotted time to address the Board, unless simultaneous translation equipment is used to allow the Board to hear the translated public testimony simultaneously. (Government Code 54954.3)

(cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning School Personnel) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

- 6. The Board president may rule on the appropriateness of a topic, subject to the following conditions:
- a. If a topic would be suitably addressed at a later time, the Board president may indicate the time and place when it should be presented.
- b. The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of its policies, procedures, programs, services, acts, or omissions. (Government Code 54954.3)
- c. The Board shall not prohibit public criticism of district employees. However, whenever a member of the public initiates specific complaints or charges against an individual employee, the Board president shall inform the complainant of the appropriate complaint procedure.

(cf. 1312.1 - Complaints Concerning District Employees) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas)

- 7. The Board president shall not permit actual disruption of Board meetings. Actual disruption by an individual or group or any conduct or statements that threaten the safety of any person(s) at the meeting shall be grounds for the president to terminate the privilege of addressing the Board and remove the individual from the meeting.
- 8. Placards, signs and other demonstrative items or visual aids (collectively referred to as "Signs") are subject to regulation. Individuals and groups with Signs must occupy the last two rows of seating provided in the meeting. Individual Signs must be held by a single person below the person's face and must not obstruct the view of Board members, language translators, or any other person attending the meeting. Signs must not contain obscene or threatening language or symbols, or otherwise disrupt the orderly conduct of the meeting."

The Board President or designee may remove an individual(s) for actually disrupting the meeting. Prior to removal, the individual shall be warned that their behavior is disrupting the meeting and that failure to cease the disruptive behavior may result in removal. If, after being warned, the individual does not promptly cease the disruptive behavior, the Board president, or designee, may then remove the individual from the meeting. (Government Code 54957.95)

When an individual's behavior constitutes the use of force or a true threat of force, the individual shall be removed from a Board meeting without a warning. (Government Code 54957.95)

Disrupting means engaging in behavior during a Board meeting that actually disrupts, disturbs, impedes, or renders infeasible the orderly conduct of the meeting and includes, but is not limited to, a failure to comply with reasonable and lawful regulations adopted by a legislative body pursuant to Section 54954.3 or any other law, or engaging in behavior that constitutes use of force or a true threat of force. (Government Code 54957.95)

True threat of force means a threat that has sufficient indicia of intent and seriousness, that a reasonable observer would perceive it to be an actual threat to use force by the person making the threat. (Government Code 54957.95)

Additionally, the Board may order the room cleared if necessary. In this case, members of the media not participating in the disturbance shall be allowed to remain, and individual(s) not participating in such disturbances may be allowed to remain at the discretion of the Board. When the room is ordered cleared due to a disturbance, further Board proceedings shall concern only matters appearing on the agenda. (Government Code 54957.9)

When such disruptive conduct occurs, the Superintendent or designee shall contact local law enforcement.

Recording by the Public

Members of the public may record an open Board meeting using an audio or video recorder, still or motion picture camera, cell phone, or other device, provided that the noise, illumination, or obstruction of view does not persistently disrupt the meeting. The Superintendent or designee shall designate locations from which members of the public may make such recordings. On a case by case basis and without causing a distraction, the Board President may permit members of the public to come to the front of the room to make such recordings.

(cf. 9324 - Minutes and Recordings)

If the Board finds the noise, illumination or obstruction of view related to these activities would persistently disrupt the proceedings, these activities shall be discontinued or restricted as determined by the Board. (Government Code 54953.5, 54953.6)

District Broadcast of Meetings:

Although not required by law to do so, the District generally broadcasts (audio and video) each regular meeting of the Board of Education in order to provide students, parents, employees and the broader community the opportunity to observe Board meetings in real time. The Board reserves the right to temporarily suspend broadcasts (video portion) when the president determines that obscene images, graphics, or signage could appear in the broadcast.

Fresno Unified Board Bylaw (BB) 9324 Minutes and Recordings

The Governing Board recognizes that maintaining accurate minutes of Board meetings provides a record of Board actions for use by district staff and the public and helps foster public trust in Board governance.

The Board aspires to:

• Investing no less than 50% of it's total Board-authorized public meeting minutes each month into effectively monitoring it's goals.

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(cf. 9000 - Role of the Board)
(cf. 9005 - Governance Standards) (cf.
9323 - Meeting Conduct)
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The secretary of the Governing Board shall keep minutes and record all official Board actions. The Board's minutes shall be public records and shall be made available to the public upon request. (Education Code 35145, 35163)

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(cf. 1340 - Access to District Records) (cf. 9122 - Secretary) (cf. 9323.2 - Actions by the Board)
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The minutes of Board meetings shall include, but not be limited to:

1. A notation of which Board members are present, in person or by teleconference, and whether a member is not present for part of the meeting due to late arrival and/or early departure

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(cf. 9250 - Remuneration, Reimbursement and Other Benefits) (cf. 9320 - Meetings and Notices)
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- 2. A brief summary of the Board's discussion on each agenda topic, rather than a verbatim record of each Board member's specific points of view during the discussion
- 3. A summary of the public comments made on agendized items and unagendized topics
- 4. The specific language of each motion and the names of the Board members who made and seconded the motion
- Preferential votes cast by student Board member(s) (Education Code 35012)

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(cf. 9150 - Student Board Members)
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6. Any action taken by the Board, and the vote or abstention on that action of each Board member present (Education Code 35145; Government Code 54953)

The minutes shall not include the student's or parent/guardian's address, telephone number, date of birth, or email address, or the student's name or other directory information as defined in Education Code 49061, unless otherwise required by law. (Education Code 49073.2)

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(cf. 5125.1 - Release of Directory Information)
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The Board agenda shall include a statement of the option and process for students and parents/guardians to request that such information be excluded from the minutes.

The Superintendent or designee shall distribute a copy of the "unapproved" minutes of the previous meeting(s) with the agenda for the next regular meeting. The Board shall approve the minutes as

circulated or with necessary amendments.

Copies of the minutes of each regular or special meeting shall be distributed to all Board members with the agenda for the next regular meeting.

Any minutes or recordings kept for Board meetings held in closed session shall be kept separately from the minutes or recordings of regular and special meetings. Minutes or recordings of closed sessions are not public records. (Government Code 54957.2)

Official Board minutes and recordings shall be stored in a secure location and shall be retained in accordance with law.

Recording or Broadcasting of Meetings

The district may tape, film, stream, or broadcast any open Board meeting.

Any district recording may be erased or destroyed 30 days after the meeting. Recordings made at the direction of the Board during a meeting are public records and, upon request, shall be made available for inspection by members of the public on a district equipment without charge. (Government Code 54953.5)

The Board aspires to:

• Conduct evaluations annually once the most recent self-evaluation score is 80 or higher and unanimously voted to adopt the results.

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The self-evaluation may addresses

- Vision & Goals: In collaboration with the Superintendent, adopt goals that are student outcome focused.

- Monitoring & Accountability: Devote significant time monthly to monitoring progress toward the goals.
- Communication & Collaboration: Lead transparently and include stakeholders in the pursuit of the goals.
- Unity & Trust: Lead with one voice in its pursuit of the goals.
- Continuous Improvement: Invest time and resources toward improving its focus on the goals.
 any areas of Board responsibility, including but not limited to Board performance in relation to visionsetting, curriculum, personnel, finance, policy, collective bargaining and community relations, and advocacy.
 The evaluation also may address objectives related to Board meeting operations, relationships among Boardmembers, relationship with the Superintendent, understanding of Board and Superintendent roles andresponsibilities, communication skills, or other governance or boardsmanship skills.

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The Board shall evaluate itself as a whole. Individual Board members also are encouraged to use the evaluation process as an opportunity to assess and set goals for their own personal performance.

During Board self-evaluations, the Board aspires to:

- Ensure that none of the Board Members have given operation advice or instruction to staff members.

Each year, The Board, will track it's progress toward becoming more focused on its goals for student outcomes using the Student Outcomes Focused Governance (SOFG) instrument for Board self-evaluation. with assistance from the Superintendent, shall determine an evaluation method or instrument that measures key components of board responsibility and previously identified performance objectives. Visual-and/or audio recordings of a Board meeting may only be used as an evaluation tool when consent is given by all Board members.

Any discussion involving the Board's self-evaluation shall be conducted in open session. At the request of the

Board, may invite the Superintendent or other individual(s) with pertinent information to provide input into the evaluation process.

Following the evaluation, the Board shall set goals, define and/or refine protocols, and establish priorities and objectives for the following quarterly year's evaluation. The Board shall also develop strategies for strengthening Board performance based on identified areas of need, including, but not limited to, Board trainings such as those offered by the California School Boards Association.

ACTION REQUESTED: DISCUSS and ADOPT

TITLE AND SUBJECT: Adopt Resolution, Approving Public Agency Retirement Services Supplementary Retirement Plan for 2025/2026

ITEM DESCRIPTION: Included in the Board material is resolution 26-21, which will provide a retirement incentive for personnel who wish to voluntarily retire on June 30, 2026. In addition, there is a contract with Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) to oversee the program. The retirement incentive must meet the district's fiscal and operational objectives for the plan to go into effect. The district may withdraw the retirement incentive if these goals are not reached. If the District withdraws the retirement incentive, resignations may be rescinded.

The district will make non-elective employer contributions to the participants' 403(b) annuity contract held with Pacific Life Insurance Company, which has been rated as A+ (Superior) by A.M. Best. The Participants will be provided with different options for receiving the funds. The district has successfully utilized PARS for early retirement program services in the past for other prior district offerings.

The Supplementary Retirement Plan (SRP) would provide participating employees with a tax-qualified annuity equal to **80**% of their 2025/26 base salary. This annuity is paid over five years. The program requires all employees to resign from district employment at the end of the school year (no later than June 30, 2026). There are approximately 1,900 District employees that meet the eligibility requirements of the plan, which is age 55 with 5 years of consecutive District service. If approved by the board, eligible participants will receive information immediately directly from PARS. Employees would have until December 5th to elect to participate.

The ultimate savings or cost of the program will be determined based on the actual number of enrolled employees, resulting replacement employee costs and the number of positions backfilled. A final analysis based on the actual enrolled employees will be presented to the board after the closing of the enrollment window. If the program is unable to demonstrate fiscal savings, the program may be rescinded. Additionally, if the plan is not implemented, the district would incur a cost of \$5,000 for administrative fees.

FINANCIAL SUMMARY: Sufficient funds in the amount of \$5,000 are available in the General Fund budget.

WHEREAS it is determined to be in the best fiscal interest of the District and its employees to provide a retirement incentive offer to eligible employees who wish to voluntarily exercise their option to separate from District Service;

WHEREAS there is no cash option available to employees in lieu of this retirement incentive offer;

WHEREAS Public Agency Retirement Services (PARS) has made available to the District a Supplementary Retirement Plan, a retirement incentive program supplementing STRS/PERS, and qualifying under the relevant sections of Section 403(b) of the Internal Revenue Code;

WHEREAS the District, pursuant to applicable policy and/or a collective bargaining agreement, desires to adopt the Supplementary Retirement Plan and to fund the incentive through nonelective employer contributions to the PARS designated 403(b) provider.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Governing Board of Education of the District hereby adopts the PARS Supplementary Retirement Plan, and the PARS Retirement Contributions Trust Agreement as part of the District retirement program, effective October 8, 2025; and
- The retirement incentive must meet the District's fiscal and operational objectives in order for the plan to go into effect. If these goals are not reached, the District may withdraw the retirement incentive. If the District withdraws the retirement incentive, resignations may be rescinded; and
- 3. The Board of Education of the District hereby appoints the <u>Chief Financial Officer</u> or his/her successor or his/her designee as the District's Plan Administrator; and
- 4. The District's PARS Plan Administrator is hereby authorized to execute the contracts, adoption agreement, and/or a custodial agreement facilitating the payment of contributions to the 403(b) arrangement, and other legal documents related to a trust or the plan on behalf of the District and to take whatever additional actions are necessary to maintain the District's participation in the plan and to maintain compliance of any relevant regulations issued.

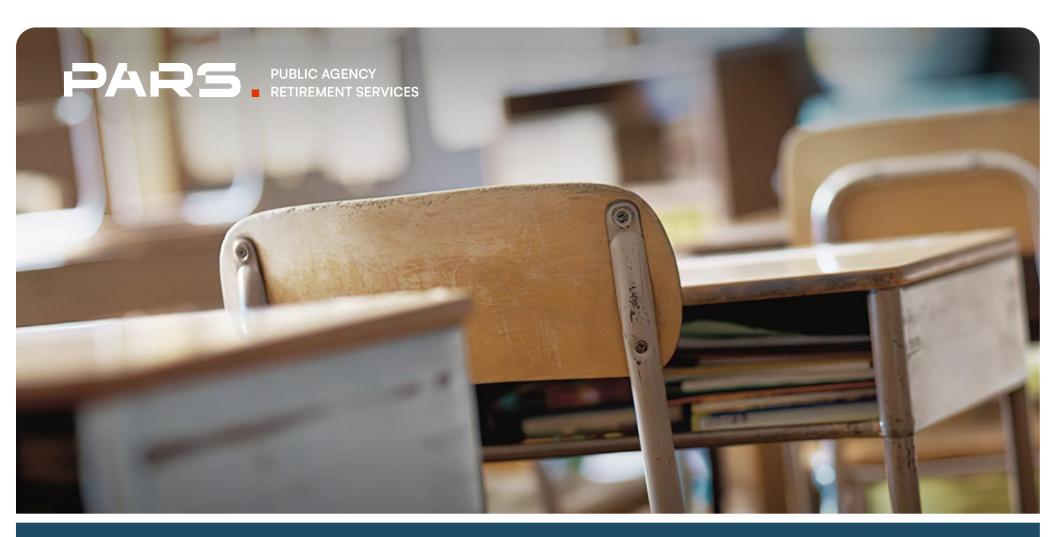

RETIREMENT INCENTIVE GOALS

- Retirement Incentive Plans encourage long-term or senior employees, typically at the top of the salary schedule, to retire early.
- The savings are achieved by replacing the senior employee with a lower paid employee or not replacing at all.
- The goal is to increase the number of natural attrition retirements by 3-4 times.
- Additional retirements from a Retirement Incentive Plan can reduce the need for layoffs for some agencies.

SRP PROCESS AND STEPS

- Board approves a contingent plan offering to designated eligible employees, which creates a 60 day enrollment window.
- Interested employees submit an irrevocable letter of resignation during the enrollment period.
- At the end of the enrollment period, a fiscal analysis is conducted to determine the savings (or cost) to District.
- Based on results, Board can determine whether Plan proceeds or is canceled.
- If Plan proceeds, employees resign.
- If Plan is canceled, the offer and resignation letters are rescinded.

B-2, PRESENT and DISCUSS Baselines for Equitable Access Interim Guardrails

For the record, the Board received no public requests to speak on agenda item B-2, Present and Discuss Baselines for Equitable Access Interim Guardrails.

For the record, Board Members provided comments and raised questions regarding agenda item B-2. A summary of Board Member feedback is outlined below:

Member Jonasson Rosas thanked staff for time in the small group sessions and reiterated part of those conversations as follows: Member Jonasson Rosas found the backwards mapping of goals productive and wanted to make sure it would indeed happen.

Member Levine thanked the Superintendent and team for their work in this area and agreed that the small group sessions were helpful. Member Levine suggested that it would be helpful in this area and other areas going forward if the number of students in each subgroup were included.

Member Wittrup expressed appreciation of the small group meetings. Member Wittrup suggested the area Students with Disabilities be presented by the 13 eligibility areas for students as the learning can be quite different. Member Wittrup asked how the district plans to capture the differences.

Member Cazares requested Superintendent to talk about how the district plans to implement yearly assessments for all seventh and eleventh grade students.

President Davis asked when will the Board see completion rates.

For the record, Superintendent Her and Carlos Castillo, Ed.D., were available to provide clarity.

B-3, DISCUSS and APPROVE Effective Staff Guardrail and Monitoring Report

For the record, the Board received no public requests to speak on agenda item B-3, Discuss and Approve Effective Staff Guardrail and Monitoring Report.

For the record, Board Members provided comments and raised questions regarding agenda item B-3. A summary of Board Member feedback is outlined below:

Member Jonasson Rosas asked fellow Board colleagues to speak slowly, concisely, and to frame smart questions as this is the first monitoring session in which Board questions will be scored. Member Jonasson Rosas reiterated the expectations to receive a score of 100% as follows: all Board members must have read the material, participate in the discussion during the Board meeting, and ask questions.

Member Cazares referenced confusion as to what the Board was asked to approve.

At this time, Member Wittrup moved to approve item B-3. Member Jonasson Rosas seconded the motion and reiterated that in order to receive a score of more than zero, active participation from all Trustees is required.

Member Levine reiterated the need for commitment to collaborate with labor partners on the structure of this guardrail. Member Levine asked if there is other thinking beyond the growth of 33% each year, as the first-year growth may not reach 33%, is there a course correction planned to help reach 66% in the next year.

President Davis requested Superintendent Her to define decision makers as used in the presentation.

Member Cazares thanked Superintendent Her for taking on the responsibilities of explaining the guardrail the Board posed for Superintendent and the staff and asked if Superintendent would explain the concept and need for guardrails.

Clerk Islas expressed appreciation for this guardrail as it relates to student outcomes and commented that we want the best teachers and staff in position to achieve the best student outcomes. Clerk Islas commented on seeing this as integral to district goals. Clerk Islas commented there may be new hires that have never had a performance evaluation and asked if observation will take place for those that do not have an established annual evaluation to upload.

Clerk Islas commented that there are three things not reflected in the presentation, they are as follows: self-reported, interview questions, and observations as milestones, and asked if the guardrail would allow for expansion of these items.

Member Islas asked what the accommodations are for people with different language backgrounds that may not be fluent in English. In terms of these specific evaluations, if supervised by an English only speaker, is there opportunity for a fair and impartial evaluation.

Member Islas asked if the evaluation tool allows for both an employee's selfevaluation and the supervisor's direct observations.

Member Islas asked if customer service is incorporated into staff evaluations.

Member Thomas asked if there is a tool for people that do not feel adequately trained can go to review training. Member Thomas commented on i-Achieve and asked if there is a way for employees to share specific information without sharing the whole evaluation.

Member Wittrup asked if there are steps the district needs to take to align with collective bargaining units.

Member Jonasson Rosas asked the questions as follows: what systems are in place to ensure compliance; why no action steps are listed to ensure evaluations are being completed, and if goals and guardrails are explicitly linked in documents.

For the record, Superintendent Her and David Chavez were available to provide clarity.

On a motion by Board Member Wittrup, seconded by Board Member Jonasson Rosas, the Board approved B-3, The Effective Staff Guardrail and Monitoring Report, by a roll call vote of 7-0-0-0 as follows: Board Members Cazares, Jonasson Rosas, Levine, Thomas, Wittrup, Clerk Islas, and President Davis.

Pursuant to California education code 44258.7(b), teachers who hold a teaching credential in a subject or subjects other than physical education may be authorized to coach one period per day in a competitive sport for which students receive physical education credit. The teacher must be a full-time employee of the school district and has completed a minimum of 20 hours of first aid instruction appropriate for the specific sport.

APPROVED as recommended, a request to hire non-credentialed consultants who possess unique skills form business, performing arts and post-secondary institutions to provide instruction to students for the 2025/26 school year. Fresno Unified School District Board Bylaw (BB) 9270 Ethics and Conflict of Interest

Ethics and Conflict of Interest Statement: The Governing Board desires to shall maintain the highest ethical standards and help ensure that decisions are made in the best interest of the district and the public students. Accordingly, no Board member, district employee, or other person in a designated position shall participate in the making of any decision for the district when the decision will or may be affected by the Board member's, district employee's, or other designated persons financial, family, or other personal interest or consideration. Board members shall not give operational advice or instructions to District staff members. Board members shall acknowledge that they are responsible for the outcomes of all students, not just students in their region of the school system. Governing Board members shall abide by and sign acknowledgement of their understanding of this statement annually.

(cf. 9005 - Governance Standards)

Even if a prohibited conflict of interest does not exist, a Board member shall abstain from voting on personnel matters that uniquely affect the Board member themselves or the Board member's relatives. However, a Board member may vote on collective bargaining agreements and personnel matters that affect a class of employees to which the Board member's relative belongs. Relative means an adult who is related to the Board member by blood or affinity within the third degree, as determined by the common law, or an individual in an adoptive relationship within the third degree. (Education Code 35107)

A relationship within the third degree includes an individual's parents, grandparents, great-grandparents, children, grandchildren, great-grandchildren, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews, and the similar family of the individual's spouse/registered domestic partner, unless the individual is widowed or divorced.

Conflict of Interest under the Political Reform Act

The Board shall adopt for the district a conflict of interest code that incorporates the provisions of 2 CCR 18730 by reference, specifies the district's designated positions, and provides the disclosure categories required for each position. The conflict of interest code shall be submitted to the district's code reviewing body for approval, in accordance with Government Code 87303 and within the deadline for submission established by the code reviewing body. (Government Code 87303)

Upon direction by the code reviewing body, the Board shall review the district's conflict of interest code and submit any changes to the code reviewing body or, if no change is required, the Board shall submit a written statement to that effect. (Government Code 87306.5)

When a change in the district's conflict of interest code is necessitated due to changed circumstances, such as the creation of new designated positions, changes to the duties assigned to existing positions, amendments, or revisions, the amended code shall be submitted to the code reviewing body within 90 days after the changed circumstances necessitating the amendments have become apparent. (Government Code 87306)

When reviewing and preparing the district's conflict of interest code, the **Board and** Superintendent or designee shall provide officers, employees, consultants, and members of the community adequate notice and a fair opportunity to present their views. (Government Code 87311)

(cf. 9320 – Meeting and Notices)

Board members and designated employees shall annually file a Statement of Economic Interest/Form 700 in accordance with the disclosure categories specified in the district's conflict of interest code. A Board member who leaves office or a designated employee who leaves district employment shall, within 30 days, file a revised statement covering the period of time between the closing date of the last required statement and the date of leaving office or district employment. (Government Code 87302, 87302.6)

(cf. 4117.2/4217.2/4317.2 – Resignation) (cf. 9222 – Resignation)

Conflict of Interest under the Political Reform Act

A Board member, designated employee, or other person in a designated position shall not make, participate in making, or in any way use or attempt to use their official position to influence a governmental decision in which they knew or has reason to know that there is a disqualifying conflict of interest. A disqualifying conflict of interest exists if the decision will have a "reasonably foreseeable material financial effect" which is distinguishable from the effect on the public generally, on the district official, the district official's immediate family, or any financial interest described in 2 CCR 18700 (Government Code 87100, 87101, 87103; 2CCR 18700-18707)

A district official makes a governmental decision when, within the authority of the office or position, the district official authorizes or directs any action on a matter, votes or provides information or opinion on it, contacts or appears before another district official for the purpose of affecting the decision, or takes any other action specified in 2 CCR 18704.

However, a Board member shall participate in the making of a contract in which the district official has a financial interest if such participation is required by the rule of necessity or legally required participation pursuant to Government Code 87101 and 2 CCR 18705.

Conflict of Interest from Campaign Contributions

There are no campaign contribution limits for school board candidates. However, prior to the district rendering a To avoid improper influence over the Board's decision making in a proceeding before the district involving a contract, the issuance of a license, permit, or other entitlements for use, as defined by Government Code 84308, including a contract, district officers, which includes a Board members whose campaign committee received a contribution of more than \$500 from any party or participant to the proceeding, or from an agent of such a party or participant, in the prior 12 months, and the party who made such a contribution, shall both publicly disclose that fact on the record of the proceeding. A person is the "agent" of a party to, or a participant in, a pending proceeding involving a license, permit, or other entitlement for use only if the person represents that party or participant for compensation and appears before or otherwise communicates with an agency for the purpose of influencing the proceeding on behalf of a party or participant. (Government Code 84308)

Additionally, if a Board member willfully or knowingly received a contribution to the Board member's campaign committee of more than \$500 from any party or participant to such a proceeding, or from an agent of a party or participant, in the prior 12 months, and knows or has reason to know that the participant has a financial interest in the district's decision, the Board member shall not make, participate in making, or in any way attempt to use the Board member's official position to influence the district's decision in the proceeding. However, a Board member may make, participate in making, or attempt to use the Board member's official position to influence the decision if the contribution is returned within 30 days after the decision was made or after the Board member knows or should have

known about the contribution and the proceeding, whichever is later. or agency heads, shall comply with Government Code 84308, including the following: (Government Code 84308)

Board members shall comply with Government Code 84308, including the following:

- 1. All Board members and the Superintendent are A district officer is prohibited from accepting, soliciting, or directing a contribution of more than \$250 \$500 to a candidate or ballot measure campaign committee from any party or participant to a proceeding before the district involving a contract, license, permit, or other entitlement for use, as defined by Government Code 84308, including a contract, or from an agent of a party or participant, that person's agent, while the proceeding is pending before the district Board and for 12 months following the date the district renders a final decision is rendered in the proceeding, if the Board member knows or Superintendent knows or has reason to know that the party or participant has a financial interest in the Board's district's decision.
- 2. However, if a Board member or the Superintendent does accept, solicit, or direct such a contribution during those 12 months but did not do so knowingly or willingly, the Board member or the Superintendent may cure the violation by ensuring that the contribution, or the portion exceeding \$500, is returned within 30 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution. The Board member or Superintendent shall maintain records of curing the violation. (Government Code 84308)
- 3. For a Board member or the Superintendent, a proceeding becomes "pending" when an item involving the contract, license, permit, or other entitlement for use, as defined by Government Code 84308, is placed on a Board agenda for discussion or decision or when it is reasonably foreseeable that the proceeding will come before the district for a decision. For a party or participant, and the agent of a party of participant, a proceeding becomes "pending" when an application is filed with the district, or, if the proceeding process does not require an application, when the proceeding is before the district for a decision or other action. (Government Code 84308)

2.A district officer who receives a contribution that would otherwise require disqualification as described in Item #2 above may participate in the proceeding if the contribution is returned within 30 days from the time the district officer knows or should have known about the contribution and the proceeding.

3.A district officer who unknowingly accepts, solicits, or directs a contribution of more than \$250 during the 12 months after the date of the Board's final decision on the proceeding may cure the violation by returning the contribution, or the portion exceeding \$250, within 14 days of accepting, soliciting, or directing the contribution, provided the district officer did not knowingly or willfully accept, solicit, or direct the prohibited contribution. The district officer shall maintain records of curing the violation.

The contributions disclosure requirements and restrictions provisions in Government Code 84308 as specified above do not apply to labor contracts, competitively bid contracts, personal employment contracts, contracts valued under \$50,000, contracts where no party receives financial compensation, or contracts with another governmental agency. (Government Code 84308)

Form 700

Each District Official shall annually file a Statement of Economic Interest/Form 700 in accordance with the disclosure categories specified in the district's conflict of interest code. An individual who ceases to be a District Official shall, within 30 days, file a revised statement covering the period of time between the

closing date of the last required statement and the date the individual ceased to be a District Official. (Government Code 87302)

(cf. 4117.2/4217.2/4317.2 – Resignation) (cf. 9222 – Resignation)

Additional Requirements for Boards that Manage Public Investments

Any Board member who manages public investments pursuant to Government Code 87200 and who has a financial interest in a decision shall, upon identifying a conflict or potential conflict of interest and immediately prior to the consideration of the matter, do all of the following: (Government Code 87105; 2 CCR 18707)

- 1. Publicly identify each financial interest that gives rise to the conflict or potential conflict of interest in detail sufficient to be understood by the public, except that disclosure of the exact street address of a residence is not required.
- 2. Not discuss or vote on the matter, or otherwise act in violation of Government Code 87100. For a This Board member, the Board member shall not be counted toward achieving a quorum while the item is discussed.

However, the Board member may speak on the issue during the time that the general public speaks on it and may leave the dais to speak from the same area as members of the public. The Board member may listen to the public discussion and deliberations of the matter with members of the public.

3. Leave the room until after the discussion, vote, and any other disposition of the matter is concluded, unless the matter has been placed on the portion of the agenda reserved for uncontested matters.

However, the Board member, district employee, or district consultant who manages public investments, as defined by Government Code 87200, may speak on the issue during the time that the general public speaks on it. Additionally, for a Board member, If the item is on the consent calendar, the Board member shall either make a motion to remove the item from the consent calendar or the Board member shall abstain from voting on the consent calendar. In any event, the Board member shall refrain from discussing or voting on the item. However, the Board member is not required to leave the room during consideration of the consent calendar.

4. If the Board's decision is made during closed session, disclose their interest orally during the open session preceding the closed session. This disclosure shall be limited to a declaration that the recusal is because of a conflict of interest pursuant to Government Code 87100. The Board member shall not be present when the item is considered in closed session and shall not knowingly obtain or review a recording or any other nonpublic information regarding the Board's decision.

(cf. 3430 - Investing) (cf. 9321 - Closed Session Purposes and Agendas) (cf. 9321.1 - Closed Session Actions and Reports)

Conflict of Interest under Government Code 1090 – Financial Interest in a Contract Board members, employees, or district consultants shall not be financially interested in any contract made by the Board on behalf of the district, including in the development, internal preliminary discussions, negotiations, modifications, compromises, planning, deliberation of issues reasoning, and specifications and solicitations for bids. If a Board member has such a financial interest in a contract made by the Board, the contract is void (Government Code 1090)

Remote Interest Exception to Government Code 1090

A Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract in which there is only a "remote interest" in the contract as specified in Government Code 1091, if the interest is disclosed during a Board meeting and noted in the official Board minutes. The affected Board member shall not vote or debate on the matter or attempt to influence any other Board member or district official to enter into the contract. (Government Code 1091)

Noninterest Exception to Government Code 1090

In addition, a Board member shall not be considered to be financially interested in a contract in which their interest is a "noninterest" as defined in Government Code 1091.5.

Noninterest includes a Board member's interest in being reimbursed for their actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their official duties, in the employment of a spouse/registered domestic partner who has been a district employee for at least one year prior to the Board member's election or appointment, or in any other applicable circumstance specified in Government Code 1091.5.

Common Law Doctrine Against Conflict of Interest

A Board member shall abstain from any official action in which the Board member's private or personal interest may conflict with official duties pursuant to the common law doctrine against conflict of interest.

Incompatible Offices and Activities

Board members shall not engage in any employment or activity or hold any office which is inconsistent with, incompatible with, in conflict with, or inimical to the Board member's duties as an officer of the district. (Government Code 1099, 1126)

(cf. 4136/4236/4336 - Nonschool Employment)

Gifts

Board members and designated employees may accept gifts only under the conditions and limitations specified in law including, but not limited to, Government Code 89503 and 2 CCR 18730.

The limitations on gifts do not apply to wedding gifts and gifts exchanged between individuals on birthdays, holidays, and other similar occasions, provided that the gifts exchanged are not substantially disproportionate in value. (Government Code 89503)

In addition, the limitation on gifts does not apply to informational materials such as books, reports, pamphlets, calendars, and periodicals. (Government Code 82028)

Gifts of travel and related lodging and subsistence shall be subject to the current gift limitation, except when: (Government Code 89506)

- 1. The travel is in connection with a speech given by a Board member or designated employee, provided the lodging and subsistence expenses are limited to the day immediately preceding, the day of, and the day immediately following the speech and the travel is within the United States.
- 2. The travel is provided by a person or agency specified in Government Code 89506, including a government, governmental agency or authority, bona fide public or private educational institution, as defined in Revenue and Taxation Code 203, or nonprofit organization exempt from taxation under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Gifts of travel exempted from the gift limitation, as described in items #1 and 2 above, shall nevertheless be reportable on the recipient's Statement of Economic Interest/Form700 as required by law.

A gift of travel does not include travel provided by the district for Board members and designated employees. (Government Code 89506)

Honoraria

Board members and designated employees shall not accept any honorarium, which is defined as any payment made in consideration for any speech given, article published, or attendance at any public or private conference, convention, meeting, social event, meal, or like gathering. (Government Code 89501, 89502)

The term honorarium does not include: (Government Code 89501)

- 1. Earned income for personal services customarily provided in connection with a bona fide business, trade, or profession, unless the sole or predominant activity of the business, trade or profession is making speeches.
- 2. Any honorarium which is not used and, within 30 days after receipt, is either returned to the donor or delivered to the district for donation into the general fund without being claimed as a deduction from income for tax purposes.

Advice

Any Board member, who, in good faith, believes that they may be subject to the requirements of this Bylaw and has questions, is unclear, or is unsure regarding the application of the requirements of this Bylaw to any particular instance or situation, may seek advice from the district's legal counsel with the permission of the Superintendent, Board President, or majority of the Board.

Training

Unless a Board member's term expires prior to January 1, 2026, each Board member shall complete ethics training in accordance with Government Code 53234-53235.2 by January 1, 2026, and at least once every two years thereafter as specified in Board Bylaw 9240 - Board Training.

Mr. Donald will provide academic support and tutoring services for one period (0.2 Full Time Equivalency) at Bullard High School to identified students and will also be teaching one section of the Men's Alliance Course (0.2 Full Time Equivalency).

Mr. Donald had effectively served as a Men's Alliance teacher for several years prior to his retirement during the 2023/24 school year. Mr. Donald will support students academically by providing high-quality instruction, offering targeted interventions when needed, and creating opportunities for students to practice critical thinking and problem-solving. He will work with our students to set goals, monitor their progress toward those goals, and connect learning to real-world applications, ensuring that every student is prepared for both college and career success.

Mr. Donald will use data provided by the California Dashboard and Bullard Administration to help increase the percentage of students who are deemed prepared according to the Career and College Indicators (CCI) Measures. In the 2024 Data provided by the California Dashboard, the percentage of students who were approaching prepared was 23.9%, and our goal is to decrease that to less than 10% for the upcoming year.
