ENGAGING REAL-WORLD LEARNING THROUGH INQUIRY

Inquiry-based learning at KIS Bangkok encourages students to ask questions, explore ideas, and connect subjects like language, maths, and science through Units of Inquiry. This approach develops critical thinking, problem-solving, and lifelong learning skills.



CONNECTING SUBJECTS THROUGH REAL-WORLD TRANSDISCIPLINARY THEMES

These are broad, real-world concepts that connect learning across multiple subjects.



For instance, students might explore 'How the World Works' by integrating different subjects. They might use science to study ecosystems, math to interpret biodiversity data, and art to visually represent environmental impact.



DEVELOPING THE WHOLE CHILD

The PYP nurtures academic, personal, and social skills, empowering students to lead, reflect, and take meaningful actions.

SPECIALIST SUBJECTS IN PRIMARY SCHOOL

Our specialist subjects help students explore diverse fields and develop new skills beyond the core curriculum. Primary students participate in a range of specialist classes designed to enrich their learning experience. Our students receive daily instruction in World Languages (Thai or Mandarin), as well as weekly specialist lessons.



COMMUNICATION FOR STRONG RELATIONSHIPS

At KIS Bangkok, we foster close communication through regular 3-way conferences, accessible teachers, class blogs, and school news. This ensures parents stay connected to their child's learning journey.



THE PYP EXHIBITION: PRIMARY PROGRAMME CULMINATION

In Grade 5, students tackle a real-world issue through the PYP Exhibition, showcasing critical thinking and responsible action.

Example: PYPx 2024 Protest Songs

Topics included: "Climate change affects natural habitats", "Bullying affects everyone involved" and "Poverty depends on social systems".

Each exhibitor took action by combining musicality with original lyrics, hooks, and melodies, inspiring empathy and encouraging others to take action.

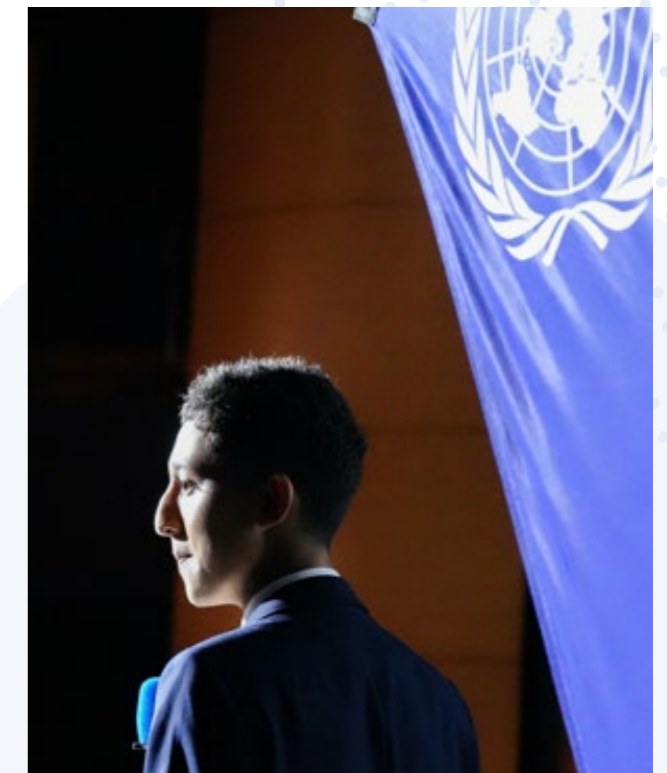
BALANCED ACADEMIC AND PERSONAL GROWTH

The MYP nurtures independence, creativity, and compassion through a challenging framework. Students grow academically while developing a love of learning.



REAL-WORLD CONNECTIONS THROUGH GLOBAL CONTEXTS

Learning through global contexts helps students develop critical thinking, adaptability, and a global perspective. This prepares them to succeed in diverse environments and tackle real-world challenges with confidence.





ACTION AND COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The MYP inspires students to take thoughtful and planned actions for the betterment of a community. Through actions and community engagements, they develop empathy, responsibility, and a sense of purpose.



THE PERSONAL PROJECT: CULMINATION OF THE MYP

In Grade 10, students complete a self-chosen Personal Project. This capstone showcases their creativity, independence, and commitment to real-world impact.

Example: 2025 Personal Project

- Creation of a series of guided relaxation tracks that incorporate soothing sounds and music to help listeners de-stress and unwind.
- Creation of an application to help chronic kidney disease patients document their sodium intake.

3-WAY CONFERENCES: COLLABORATING FOR SUCCESS

Collaborating to reflect on progress, celebrate growth, and set goals, empowering student ownership of learning.

CONNECTING SUBJECTS: INTERDISCIPLINARY LEARNING

Connecting subjects helps students apply knowledge in meaningful ways. For example, in an MYP unit on climate change, students might use science to analyse data, geography to understand global impacts, and language to present persuasive solutions.

HOLISTIC ASSESSMENT

MYP assessments offer students an opportunity to show their development and understanding across four criteria in each subject. Each semester, students receive a level from 1-8 for each criterion (e.g., Analysing, Organising, Knowing and Understanding, Communicating).

HOMEBASE: BUILDING STRONG BONDS

Homebase groups, led by teachers, foster student wellbeing, social-emotional growth, academic guidance, and a sense of community belonging. They also aim to build strong peer relationships and student-teacher connections.

IB DIPLOMA PROGRAMME



GRADES 11 AND 12 PATHWAYS

In their final two years at KIS, students can choose one of three pathways: The IB Diploma Programme, The Career-related Programme, or a KIS High School Diploma Programme with IB Certificates.



A WORLD-CLASS EDUCATION

The IB Diploma Programme is internationally recognised by universities worldwide and prepares students with a rigorous curriculum that fosters critical thinking, cultural awareness, and essential life skills.

CRITICAL THINKING AND CREATIVITY THROUGH THE DP CORE

Theory of Knowledge (TOK):

Explores how we construct, test, validate, and share different types of knowledge. Put simply, this component asks students to question what they know and how they know it.

Creativity, Activity, Service (CAS):

Fosters personal growth and encourages students to make a positive impact on communities.

Example:

- **Science For All:** This student-led club partners with schools to design, organise, and deliver hands-on science experiments for underprivileged children. Founded and led by girls, members develop essential skills in communication, collaboration, and problem-solving while sparking curiosity in STEM. As a CAS project, it highlights their dedication to creating a positive impact and nurturing a love for science in younger students.

Extended Essay (EE):

A 4,000-word independent research project.

Example:

- **Visual Arts:** Let Them Eat Moschino: To What Extent was Moschino's Fall 2020 Ready-to-Wear Collection Influenced by the Rococo Movement?
- **Psychology:** tDCS and Neurorehabilitation: To What Extent Does Transcranial Direct Current Stimulation (tDCS) Aid Neurorehabilitation in Motor Skills in Stroke Patients?

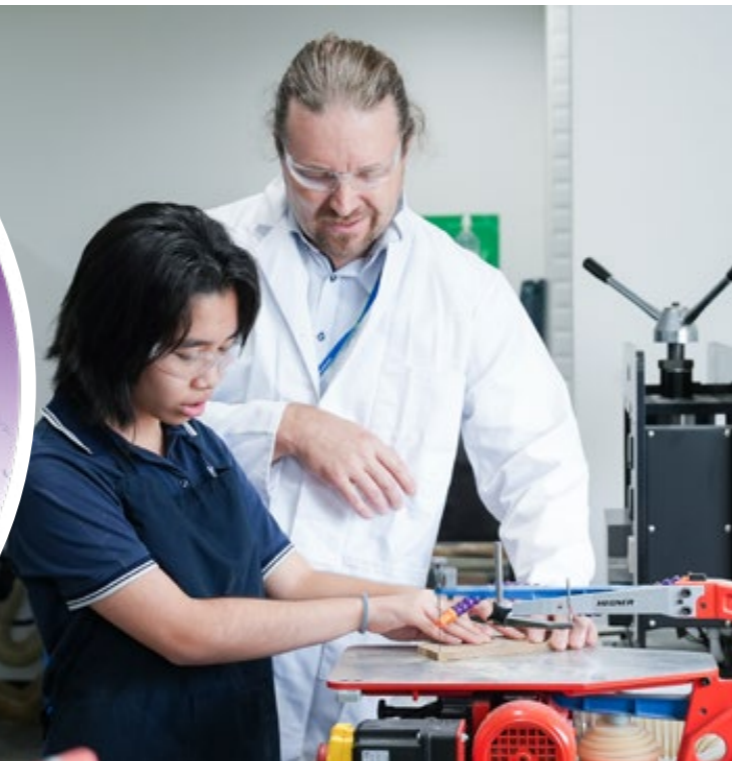

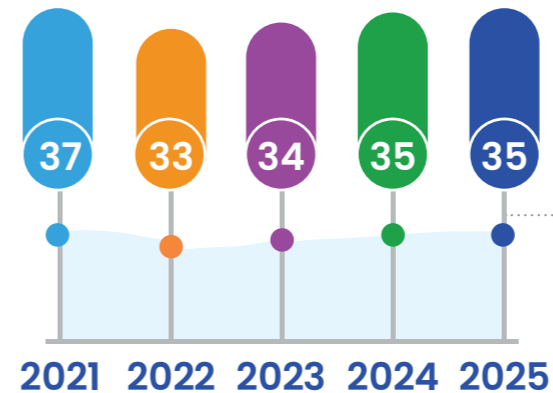

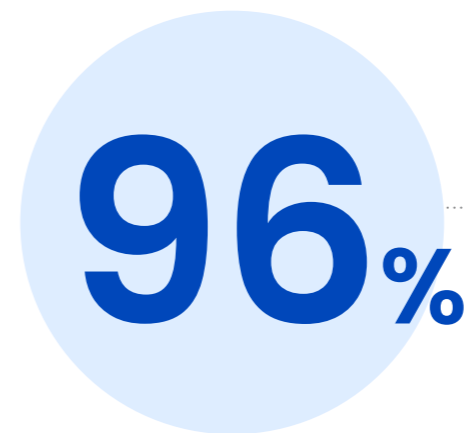

COUNSELLING

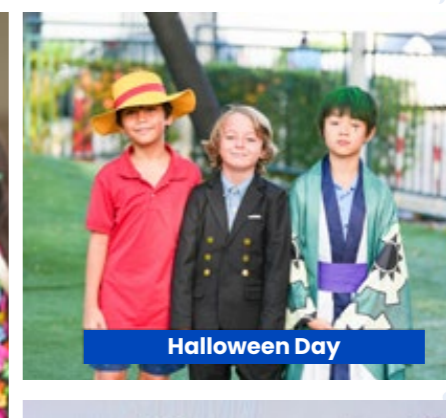
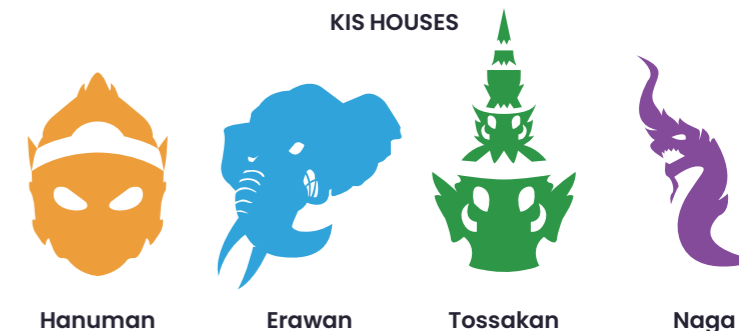


A VIBRANT COMMUNITY IN A LIVELY CAMPUS

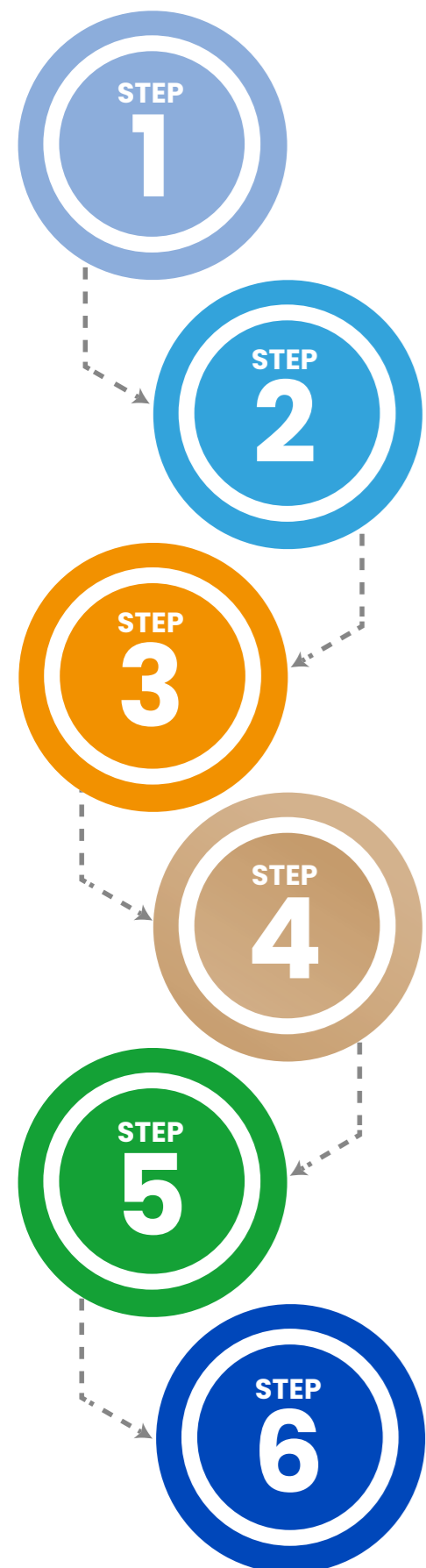
