## What is Title I?

College Park Elementary School is identified as a Title I school as part of Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). Title I is designed to support State and local school reform efforts tied to the challenging State academic standards, to improve teaching and learning for students. Title I programs must be based on effective means of improving student achievement and include strategies to support family engagement.
