\* The 2024-2025 report is preliminary pending financial audit, accreditation, and prior year metrics.

\*\* A school must be eligible for a minimum of 50 points possible on the performance framework score for the score to be displayed. If a school is not eligible for at least 50 possible points, the rates for each measure will be displayed, but an overall score will not be calculated or displayed. In this case, in the first year of the new performance framework, we did not have growth data. Our framework relies on cohorts to test in the 10th and 11th grades to obtain growth data.

**Based on Tulsa Public Schools' charter framework, we are recommending a 3-year renewal term for KIPP for both grade bands.**

KIPP Tulsa College Prep (grades 6-8) has shown increasing academic performance. KIPP Tulsa University Prep (grades 9-12) is working to improve growth and proficiency by implementing course corrections. Drawing on experience from middle school to provide equitable support for all students, the high school is adopting a Multi-Tiered System of Support structure. This approach involves curriculum changes and the use of i-Ready baseline assessments to identify instructional gaps and monitor progress. Additionally, weekly academic progress monitoring has been implemented.

Within the contract period, from 2023 to 2026, KIPP Tulsa has received clear financial audits. KIPP's accreditation for the contract years follows. KIPP has implemented stronger internal controls and partnered with accounting consultants to address past compliance issues.

*Additional information on metrics:*

*Academic Domain, Middle School*

- 2022-23: The middle school received full points for ELA proficiency and growth, as well as math subpopulation proficiency. KIPP met the target for math growth and proficiency in the math subpopulation. They met the target for math growth and received just under half of the points for math subpopulation growth and math proficiency. Partial points were awarded for re-enrollment, full points for meeting their mission-specific measure goal, and no points were awarded for the school climate survey due to not meeting the response threshold.

- 2023-24: KIPP middle school received full points for 7 of 8 measures, receiving partial points for math proficiency. Their mission-specific measure goal wasn't met, but it was a bold goal: 50% of students in the bottom quartile will grow 2 years from Fall to Spring MAP assessment. MAP scores were improved over the prior year. The overall scores were improved over the prior year.
- 2024-25: Preliminary scores indicate that the middle school continues to show improvement in proficiency and growth metrics, earning full points again in 7/8 metrics, while the math subpopulation's proficiency earned partial points. KIPP wasn't awarded points for re-enrollment, but received full points for the school climate survey and their mission-specific measure, a repeat of last year's goal: 50% of students in the bottom quartile will grow 2 years from Fall to Spring MAP assessment.

### *Academic Domain, High School*

- 2022-23: The high school did not meet the academic minimum points for scoring, but available scores met the targets.
- 2023-24: The high school received full points on 4 of 9 measures, earning zero points on ELA growth, math subpopulation growth, and math subpopulation proficiency. They received reduced points for math proficiency. The high school received points for the mission-specific measure: 85% of seniors will apply and be accepted to at least one college. The graduation rate was 97%. In the previous year, they received full points for ELA and math proficiency. There were no growth points assessed for high schools the prior year, our first under the new SPF, to allow time for the cohort to test in 10th and then again in 11th.
- 2024-25: The high school received full points for math growth, math subpopulation growth, and ELA subpopulation proficiency. They received partial points for math proficiency, improving most growth scores over the prior year. KIPP did not earn points for scores in ELA growth, ELA proficiency, nor in math or ELA subpopulation proficiency. KIPP's reported graduation rate was 100%. KIPP High School received full points for the school climate survey and mission-specific measure: 85% of seniors will apply and be accepted to at least one college.

### *Financial Domain*

- 2022-23: KIPP met the standard in all categories except enrollment stability, where they received an approaches standard rating, and oversight capacity, where they received a fails to meet standard rating for staff not having appropriate financial expertise.
- 2023-24: KIPP met the standard in all categories except enrollment stability, where they received a rating of approaching standard. KIPP improved metrics in 3 measures from the prior year.
- 2024-25: KIPP provisionally met the standard in all categories except for enrollment stability, where they received a rating of approaches standard. Two metrics were excluded until the FY25 financial audit is available in April 2026 and the preliminary annual report is made final.

## *Organizational Domain*

- 2022-23: KIPP met the standard in all categories except 1a: Board governance for accreditation deficiencies and 3: Supporting Students for discrepancies in enrollment practices during Spring 2023 enrollment window.
- 2023-24: KIPP met the standard in all categories except 1a: Board governance for accreditation deficiencies.
- 2024-25: KIPP provisionally met the standard in all categories except 1a: board governance for accreditation deficiencies and 4a: enacting key school design elements because the school didn't meet the majority of the academic goals stated in the application within the current charter term.
